As I stated, I work a full time job, have a family and try my best, I am a real person that benefits from this program. I don't believe in any way that I abuse it and it has truly helped me.

This is a safety net for someone with a chronic illness. That not if, but when something happens there is help. I am more than thankful for what it has done for me in the past. I hope this program can continue not only for myself but other families.

As a concerned citizen of Ohio, I ask you to reject the proposed changes to the CMH program and continue to protect these vital services.

The proposed changes to the program will reduce available services and will dramatically limit continued eligibility for middle-income families. I do not fall under the "middle-income" category, I am a low income family. I do not inform you of this for sympathy, this program has greatly helped me. Please ensure that the program stays intact and supports our most vulnerable children in low-income and middle-income families.
