House Public Utilities Committee Written Opponent Testimony House Bill 114

Chairman Seitz, Vice Chair Carfagna, Ranking Member Ashford, and members of the House Public Utilities Committee, my name is James O'Bryant and I am a consultant for the Environmental Defense Fund in Ohio. Thank you for providing me with the opportunity to provide written testimony in opposition to House Bill 114.

The Environmental Defense Fund (EDF) is a national organization that links science, economics, law and private-sector partnerships to solve our most serious environmental challenges.

HB 114 goes even further than HB 554 – which Governor Kasich vetoed in December 2016 – by changing the state's renewable energy standards into unenforceable goals and reducing the energy efficiency benchmarks, with no regard for the resulting economic consequences.

By taking this quick action, the Ohio House ignores the positive economic benefits of clean energy. Ohio stands to lose significant capital investment & job growth if this shortsighted bill is enacted.

The market likes certainty and our current on-again/ off-again energy policy does not provide that certainty. Ohio has a real opportunity to expand its clean energy industries, while also incorporating energy-saving efficiency measures. However, HB 114 would negatively impact Ohio's ability recognize these opportunities.

Ohio has a choice: become a leader in the clean energy transition, or watch as other states take advantage of the benefits of clean energy and efficiency. There are reasonable options for attracting new investments to the state, creating jobs, and providing Ohioans with a cleaner, more efficient and affordable energy system. Ohio should position itself as a leader of the clean energy future.
