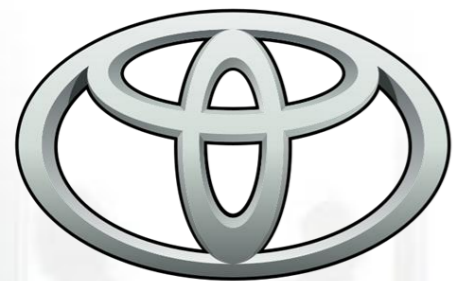

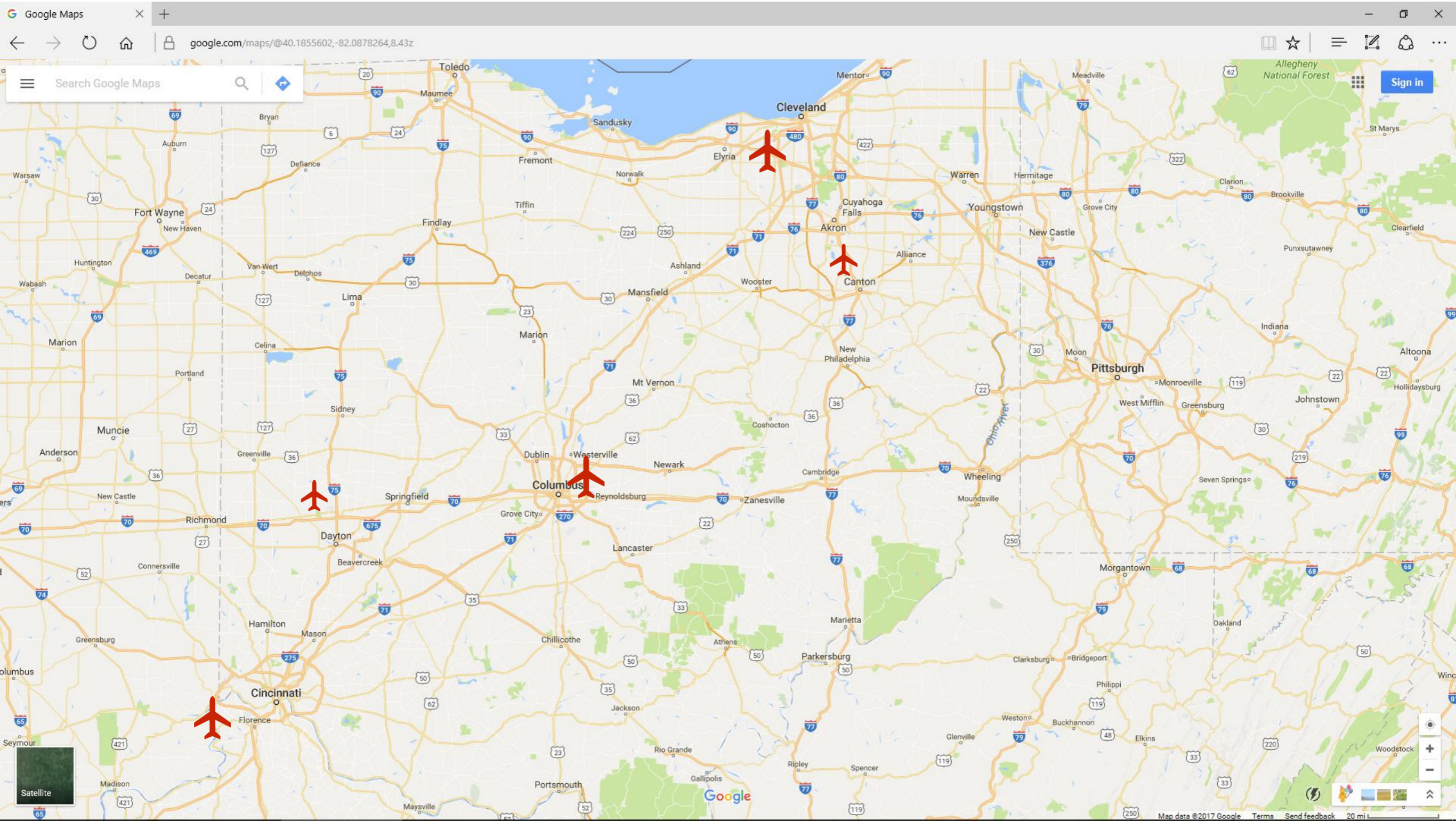

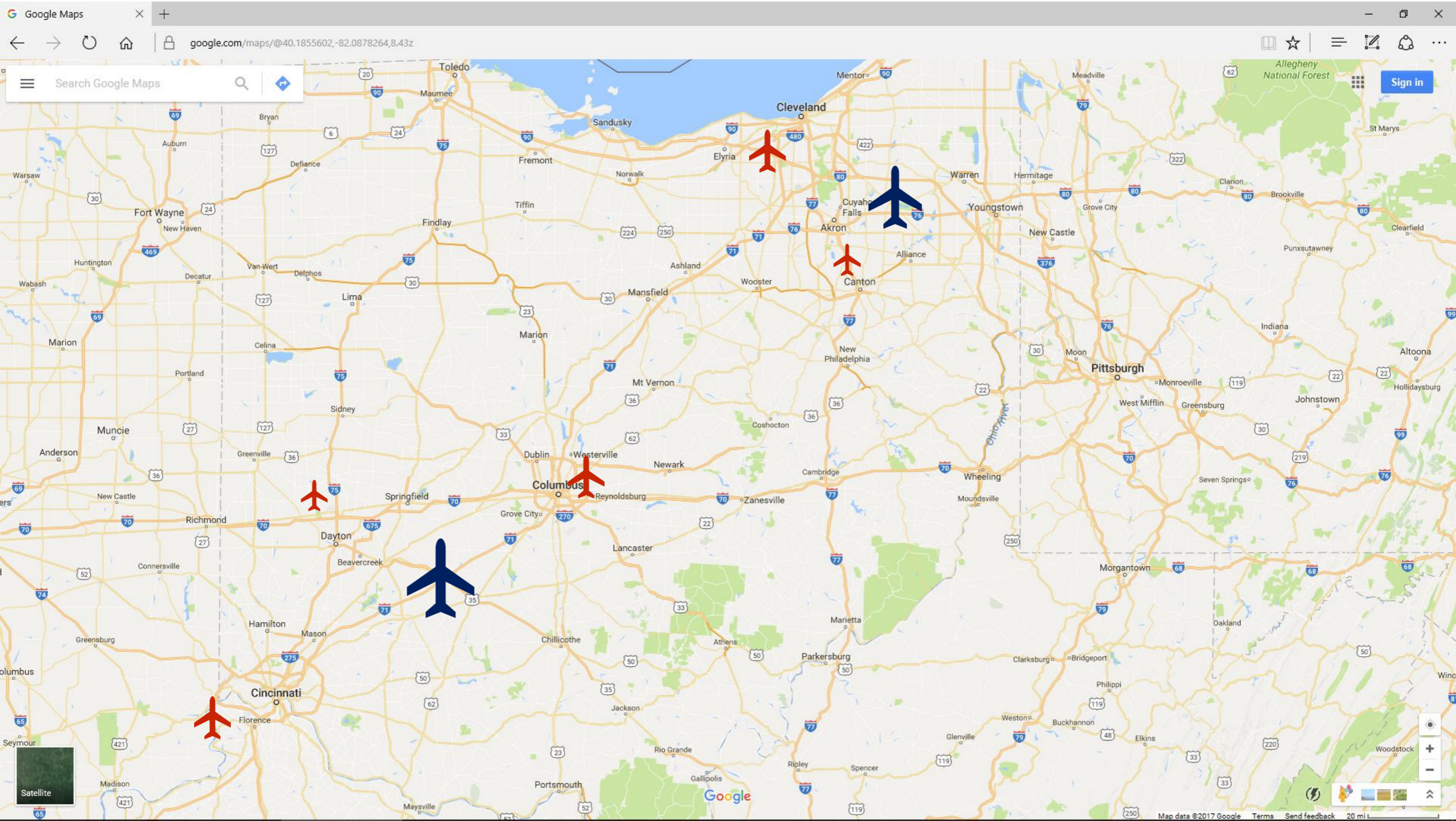

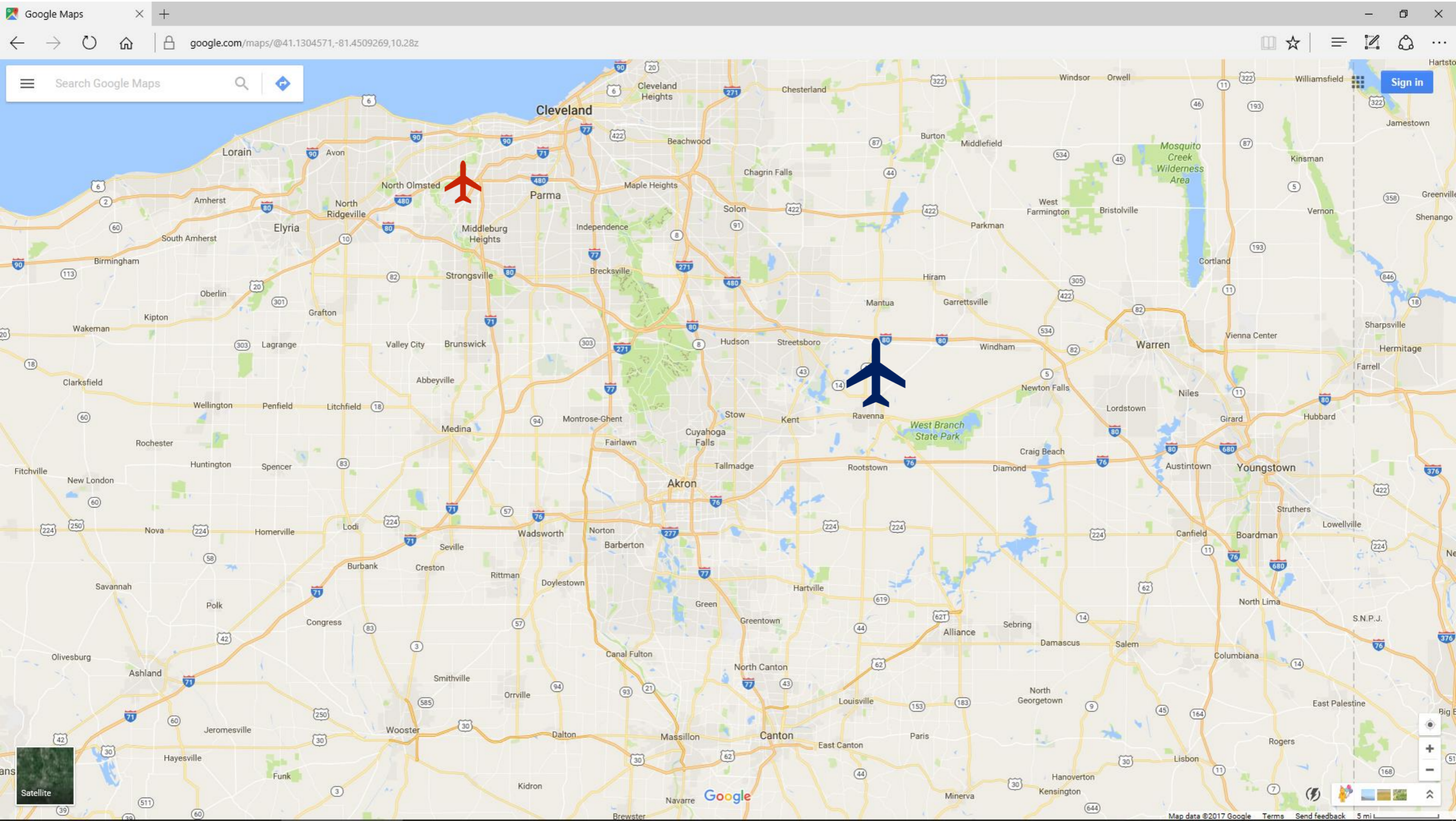

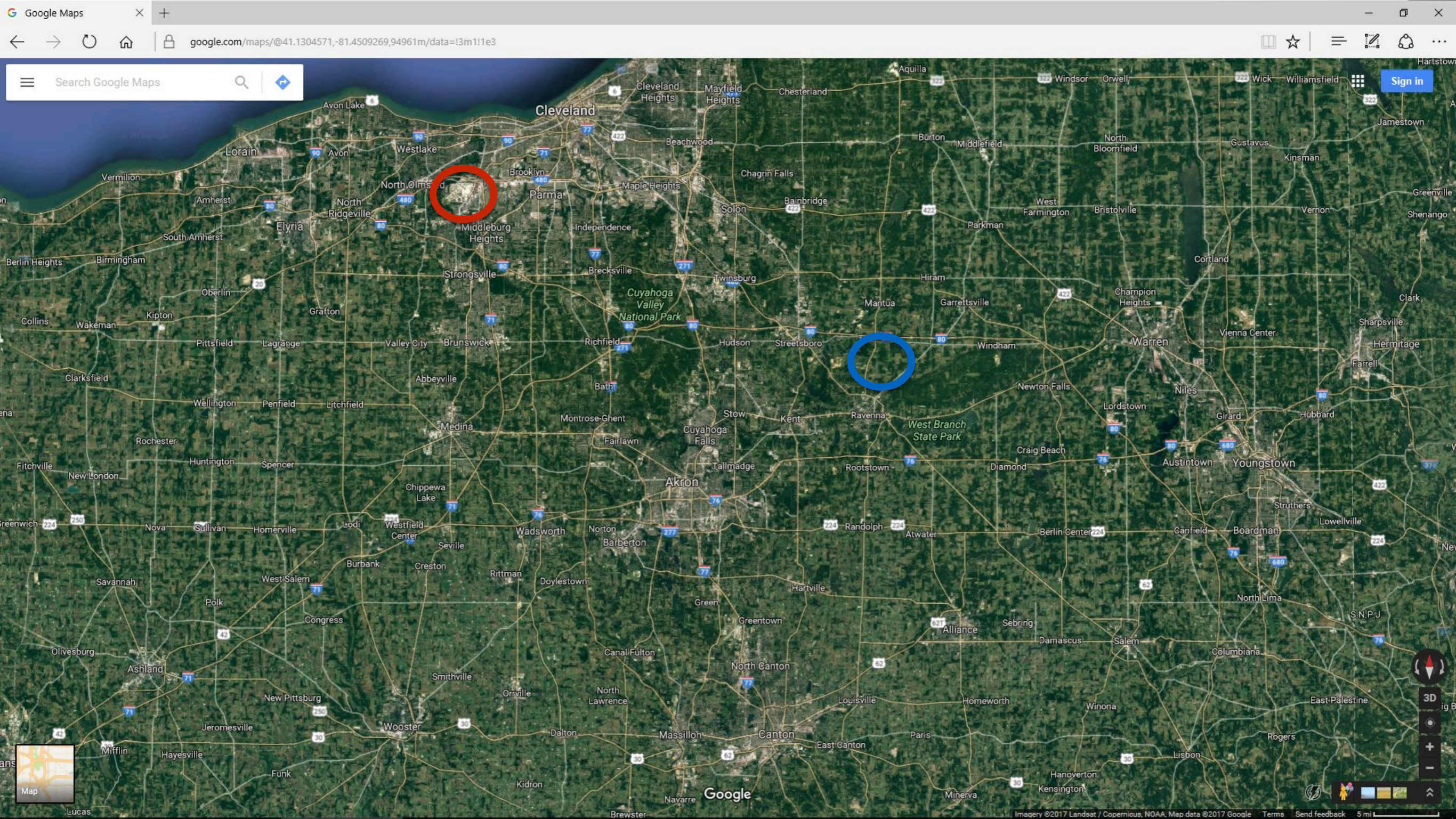

## Northeast Ohio Region

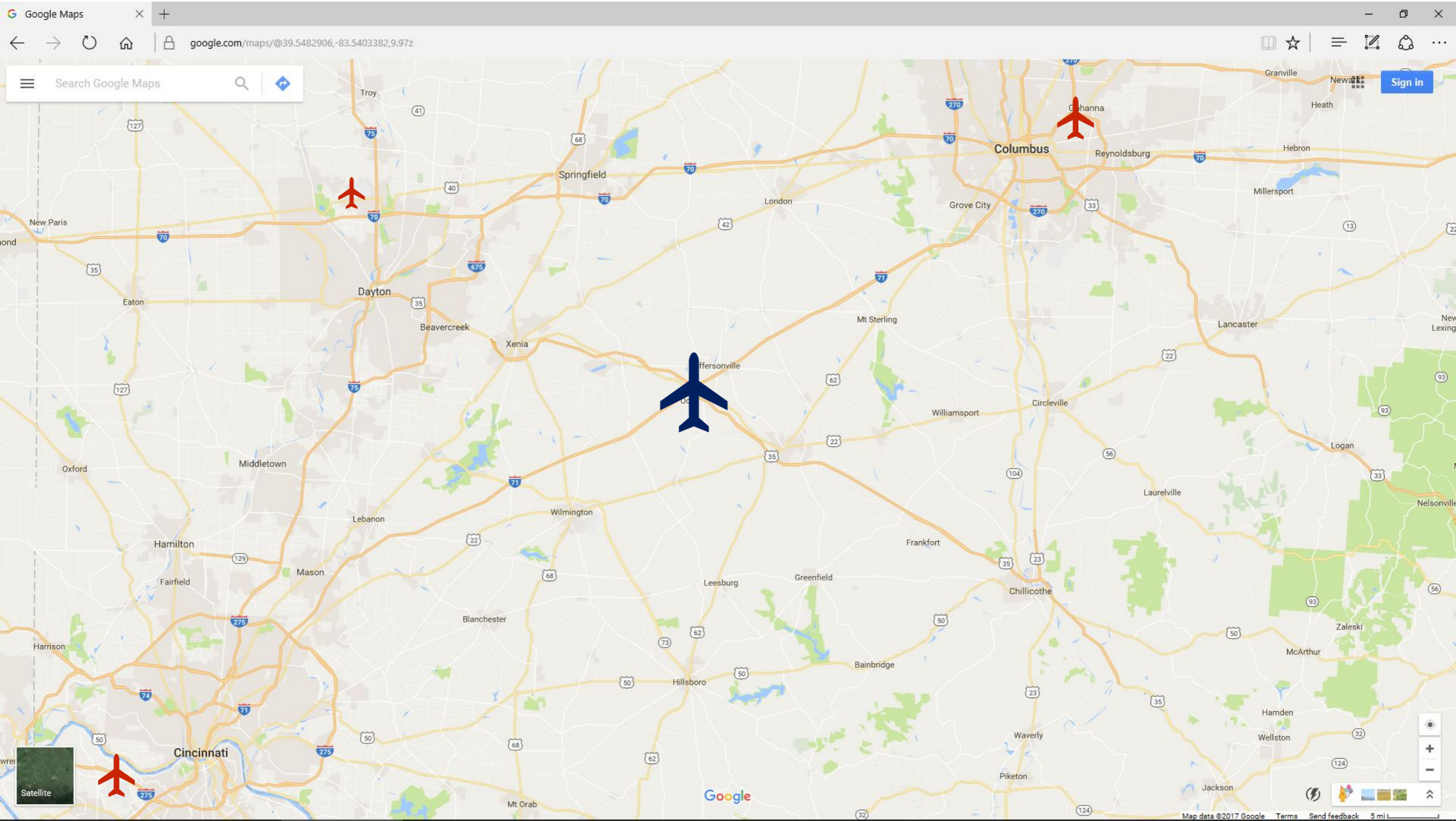

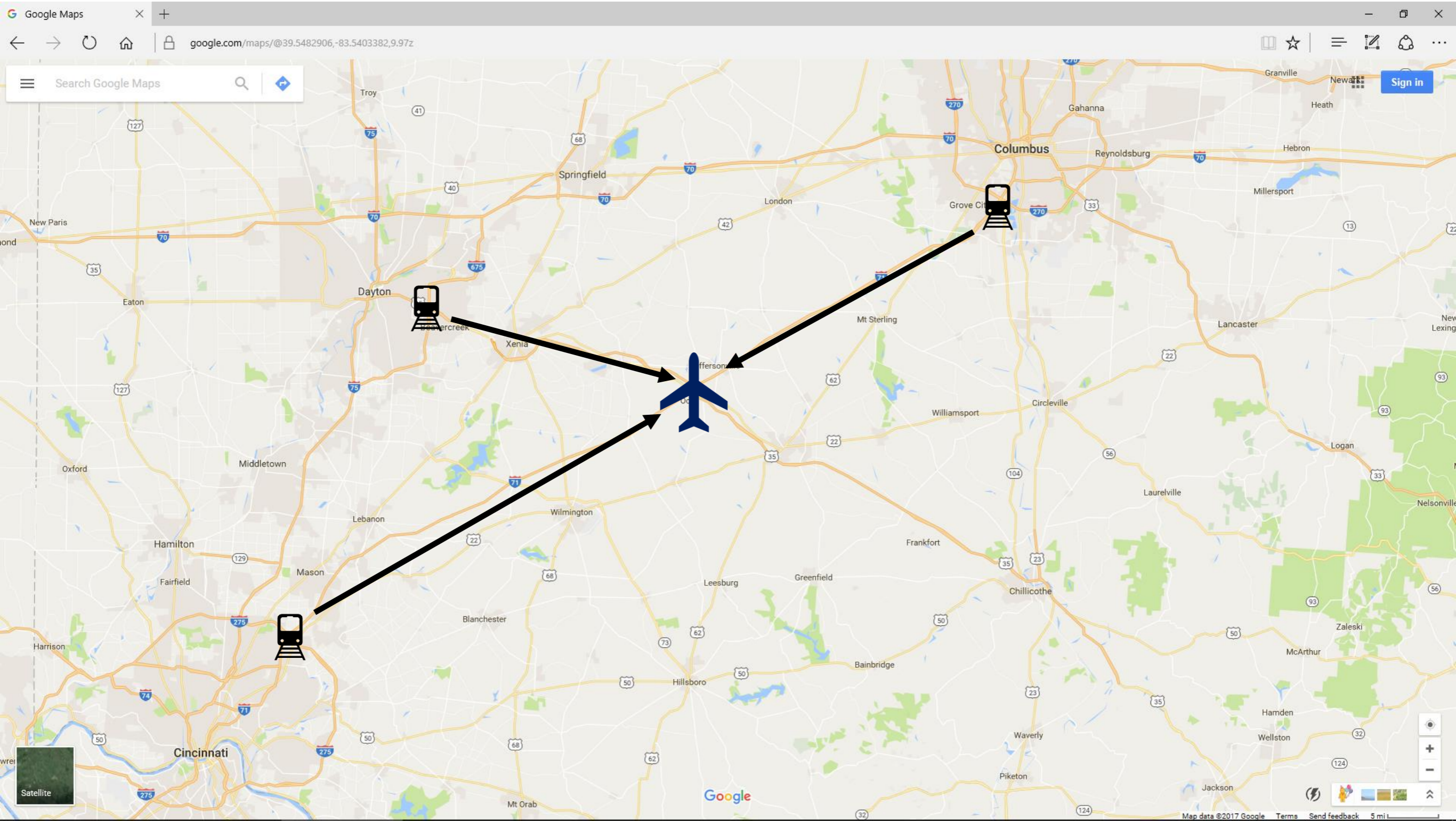

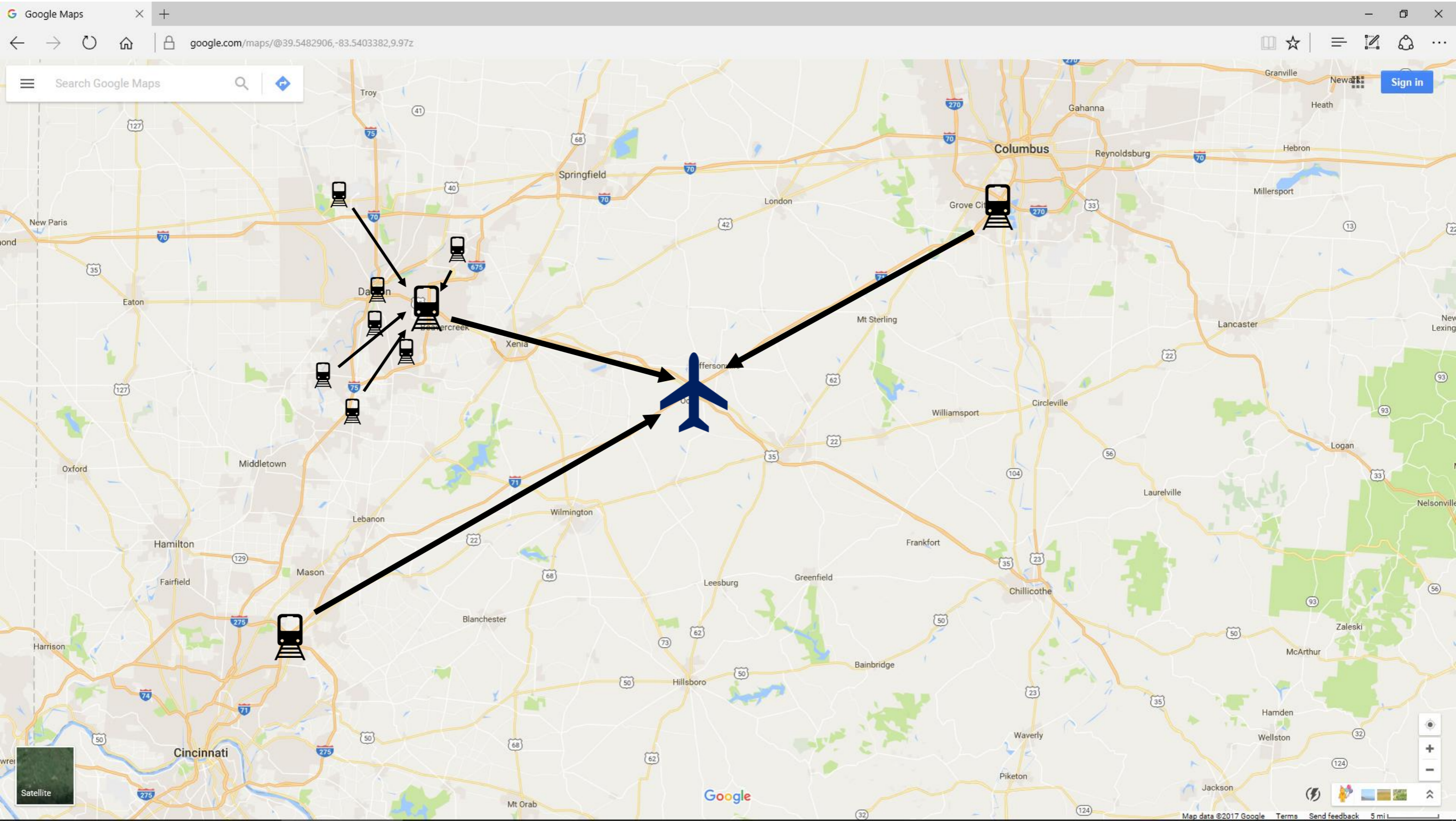

## Transportation Hubs (Phase I)



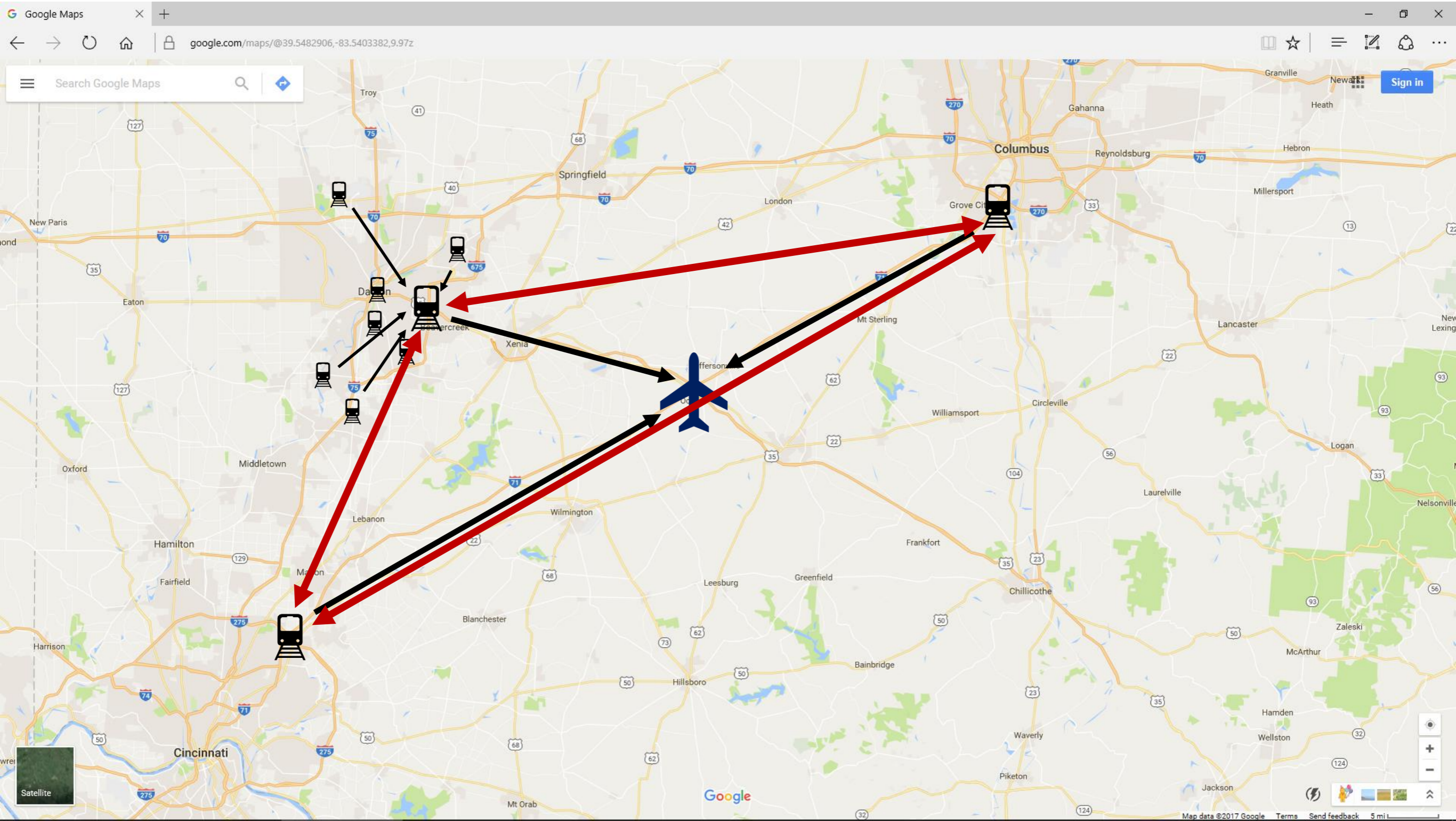

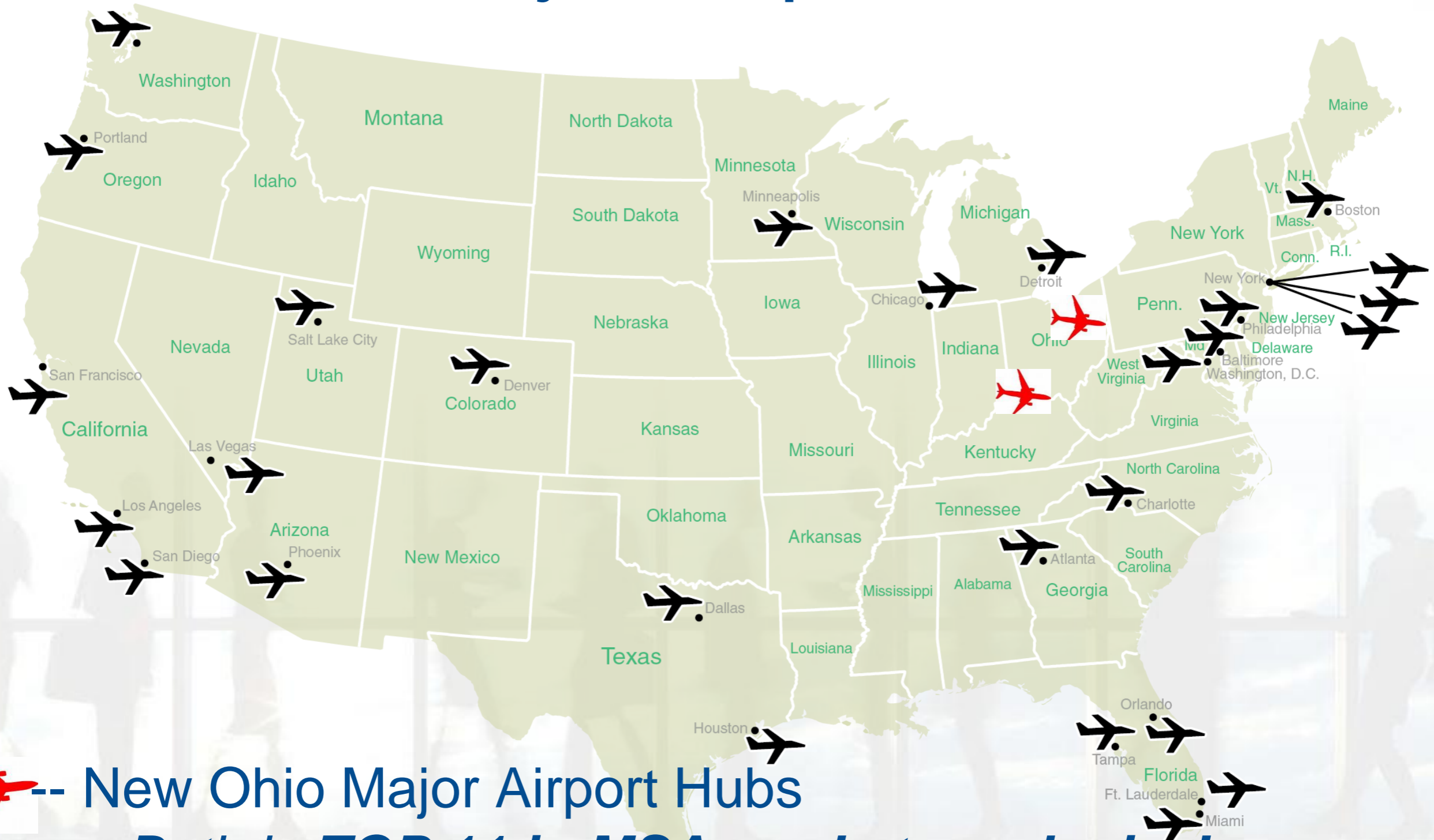
