Chair Bacon, Vice-Chair Dolan, Ranking Member Thomas and members of the Senate Judiciary Committee, thank you for the opportunity to offer proponent testimony on Senate Bill 244, a bill to increase the penalties for promoting prostitution.

Under current law the offense of promoting prostitution is generally a fourth degree felony. This penalty is enhanced to a felony of the third degree if the prostitute is a minor. An offender is subject to a mandatory prison term only when the offense of promoting prostitution is committed in furtherance of human trafficking. The penalty is always a fourth degree felony regardless of the number of times an individual is convicted of promoting prostitution. This provides little deterrent to repeat violators and does not reflect the level of criminality.

Senate Bill 244 provides for an increased penalty for individuals with previous convictions for promoting prostitution. Importantly, the bill also provides for an increased penalty for individuals who are convicted of trafficking in drugs along with promoting prostitution. Drug abuse leaves individuals more vulnerable to prostitution as they attempt to find ways to fuel their addiction. This makes these individuals easier targets offenders engaged in promoting prostitution. Finally, the bill provides for mandatory prison

Like the bill sponsors, we believe that the offenses of human trafficking and promoting prostitution can be curtailed by imposing stiffer penalties on those who commit these crimes. By providing for graduated penalties, Senate Bill 244 will help deter these crimes and ensure that individuals who continue to victimize the vulnerable spend more time in prison. This promotes safety for victims and our communities.
