Dear Chair Bacon, Vice Chair Dolan, Ranking Member Thomas & Committee Members:

As President of the Ohio Association of Magistrates, I am writing on behalf of our members to express our support of HB 341.

As judicial officers, we perform many of the same functions as judges. This includes holding hearings and making decisions that affect individuals. Often the individual associates a negative outcome to his/her case with the person who conducts the hearing. We are frequently reminded to protect our safety and our family's safety, both in the courthouse and outside the courthouse. The ability for a litigant to retrieve our personal information as a public record document does not comport with protecting our safety.

I can relate two incidents of which I am aware that underscore the need to include magistrates in the bill. Several years ago, a magistrate came home from the downtown courthouse to find a litigant on her front porch in the suburbs. After the police arrived, she learned that the litigant had taken a bus to her home. Another magistrate was the subject of a public records request several years ago when a disgruntled litigant asked for her address and other personal information. This litigant had exhibited aggressive behavior during the pendency of his case. Luckily these incidents did not result in any negative consequences except for stress and extra vigilance.

By including magistrates and judges in this bill, the legislature would be providing protection to all judicial officers at the same level of other public service workers.
