McFARLAND Washington County Secretary/Treasurer On behalf of the County Auditors' Association of Ohio I offer our support for HB 118, currently pending in the Senate Ways & Means Committee. HB 118 essentially codifies recent court decisions and is designed to prevent County Boards of Revision (BOR) from dismissing a complaint if the complaint does not name the correct property owner. Although it is unlikely a BOR would currently dismiss a complaint if the owner is not properly named, this legislation further supports the court cases that have held that the failure to name the correct property owner does not deprive the BOR of jurisdiction and therefore the BOR cannot dismiss on that ground.
