TESTIMONY BY CHIP HART, HART PRODUCTIONS INC, NEW RICHMOND (Cincinnati), OHIO

OPPOSING S.B. 252

To Senator John Eklund & Committee Members:

Thank you for this and the prior opportunities to provide testimony. I would be present however school is out and a previous out of state engagement with family took precedent. As succinctly as possible, I wish to show how the Gr. Cincinnati Convention & Visitors Bureau (GCCVB) staff and executives regularly had distorted facts when engaging government, political, business leaders, and media to sway policymaking decisions and attempting to spend the lodging tax money on prior and future expansions of the Cincinnati Convention Center.

First, to convince Cincinnati City Council to vote against Hart Productions' desire to seek an expansion of a current City ordinance to give consumer shows better date protection, they:

- A) Provided a list of cities with convention centers that do not protect consumer show dates. However, they intentionally omitted (provided false information) that these cities have not 1 convention center like Cincinnati, <u>BUT 2 facilities</u> (1 to house consumer events and 1 to house conventions) OR 1 FACILITIY up to 3 times as large as Cincinnati. By omission, this leads elected leaders and administration to assume that Cincinnati should be like those other cities when this is completely false. <u>SEE COMPETITIVE FACILITIES DOCUMENT ATTACHED</u>
- B) Provide elected officials, administration, and business leaders with completely false, erroneous, and intentionally artificially constructed economic impacts of conventions and trade shows based solely on "projected attendance and projected hotel room usage". Never is factual data provided by the GCCVB and their hotel partners on actual hotel room block pickup, duration of stays, or post-convention attendance detailing single and multiple day registrations.

However, since the first hearing on SB 252, The Board of the GCCVB has just hired a new Executive/CEO by the name of Julie Harrison Calvert. It is my gut feeling that she will be cleaning up the reporting practices and vetting of all convention and trade show business. And I will certainly be encouraging her to do that.

In the meantime, I urge this Committee to again make all CVB's subject to the open records act and also encourage the responsible, accurate reporting, and transparency of the use of the bed tax funds when elected officials and/or their appointees are on the board of directors.

THOUSANDS TO DANCE IN CINCINNATI AT NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

This week, more than 3,000 dancers from around the world will converge in Cincinnati USA for the 66th National Square Dance Convention. The convention, which will run through Saturday, June 24, marks 25 years since the NSDC's first Cincinnati meeting in 1992.

Beginning Wednesday, June 21, a variety of dancers will arrive in Cincinnati to take part in panels, seminars, performances, exhibitions, a fashion show and various other events. All 50 states will be represented at the convention, along with attendees from Canada, Germany, Taiwan, Ireland, the Philippines and Japan.

"Cincinnati is thriving right now, which makes it the perfect time for such an energetic, spirited group to return to our city. Our region's passion for the arts, the vibrancy of downtown and its unprecedented revitalization will truly be showcased during this week of dance and celebration," said Dan Lincoln, president and CEO of the Cincinnati USA Convention & Visitors Bureau.

During the convention, which continues to be the largest of its kind, attendees will attempt to break the Guinness Record for largest square dance in the world. With approval from the Guinness World Records and the City of Cincinnati, dancers will come together at the Duke Energy Convention Center on Saturday, June 24 at 3 p.m. in an attempt to set the record. Currently, the largest square dance is 1,040 participants, achieved in Riverside, Calif., in May 2016.

"Our dancers are passionate about square dancing, and we want to share that passion not only with Cincinnati, but with the world. We're excited about our chance to record this world record, and look forward to dancing on Fountain Square after the event to celebrate the achievement," said Steve Stochr, general chairman for convention.

Immediately following the world record attempt, dancers will gather at Fountain Square for a public performance from 3:30 – 4:30 p.m. The public is invited to purchase spectator tickets for \$5 throughout the convention for the opportunity to see various dance levels and styles, including contra, square, round, line, clogging and country western.

Programming for the convention will be held primarily at the Duke Energy Convention Center, with the exception of a few events at the Millennium Hotel and Hyatt Regency Cincinnati. Attendees will be staying at the Millennium, Hyatt, Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza, Westin and Hampton

# National Square Dance Convention returning in 2017

CINCINNATI, OH (FOX19) - Circle left, circle right, grab your partner and do-si-do on down to the National Square Dance Convention (NSDC) coming in June 2017.

Yep, the NSDC's 66th National Convention will be in Cincinnati June 21-24, marking 25 years since the convention's first Cincinnati meeting in 1992.

Organizers say the event is expected to attract more than 4,000 square dancers from around the United States and the world, with key foreign delegations coming from Japan, Sweden, and Germany. Attendees will account for 5,500 hotel room nights at downtown hotels, meaning an economic impact of approximately \$1.6 million for the region.

"Square dancing is an integral part of the daily lives of our delegates, and traveling for our annual convention is the perfect way to most other dancers while discovering a new city," said Steve Stochr, general chairman for the 2017 convention. "I am looking forward to bringing our convention back to Cincinnati to showcase square dancing in a city that appreciates music and the arts."

The convention will be held primarily at the Duke Energy Convention Center, including panels, seminars, performances, exhibitions and a fashion show, organizers say.

The 1992 Square Dance Convention was the largest event ever hosted by the Cincinnati USA region until the 2012 World Choir Games.

According to the Cincinnati USA Convention & Visitors Bureau, Cincinnati won the right to host the 2017 National Convention by a majority vote of 30 member delegates in the summer of 2013.






