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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.872 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Canton Bulldogs" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.872 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.50, 4503.501, 11  
4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.521, 4503.522, 12  
4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 4503.529, 13  
4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 4503.552, 14  
4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 4503.562, 15  
4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.576, 4503.577, 4503.591, 4503.592, 16  
4503.67, 4503.68, 4503.69, 4503.701, 4503.702, 4503.71, 17  
4503.711, 4503.712, 4503.713, 4503.715, 4503.72, 4503.722, 18

4503.73, 4503.732, 4503.733, 4503.74, 4503.75, 4503.751, 19  
4503.752, 4503.763, 4503.85, 4503.86, 4503.87, 4503.871, 20  
4503.872, 4503.874, 4503.877, 4503.89, 4503.90, 4503.901, 21  
4503.902, 4503.903, 4503.904, 4503.92, 4503.94, 4503.97, and 22  
4503.98 of the Revised Code. 23

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 24  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 25

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 26  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 27  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 28  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 29  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 30  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 31  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 32  
other abortion-related activities. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 35  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 36  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 37  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 38  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 39  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 40  
other money in that fund. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 42  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 43  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 44  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 45

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 46  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 47

national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 48  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 49  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 50  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 51  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 52  
directly to their clients. 53

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 54  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 55  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 56  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 57  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 59  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 60  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 61  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 62  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 65  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 66  
its research and other programs. 67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 68  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 69  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 70  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 72  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 73  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 74  
contributions for its research and other programs. 75

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 76

receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 77  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 78  
contributions into its general account to be used for 79  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 80  
America foundation. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 83  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 84  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 85  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 86

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 87  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 88  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 89  
scholarships and other educational activities. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 91  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 92  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 93  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 94  
that organization. 95

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 96  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 97  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 98  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 99  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 100  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 101  
scholarship fund. 102

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 103  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 104  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 105

awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 106  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 107  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 108  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 109  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 110  
funds as provided in this section. 111

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 112  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 113  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 114  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 115  
cyclists of all ages. 116

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 117  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 118  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 119  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 120  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 121  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 122  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 125  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 126  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 127  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 130  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 131  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 132  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134

receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 135  
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 136  
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 137  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 138  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 139  
sponsors within this state. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 142  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 143  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 144  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 145  
activities. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 148  
Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 149  
money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 150  
incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 151  
provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 152  
this state. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 155  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 156  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 157  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 158  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 159  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 160  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 161  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 164

thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 165  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 166  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 167  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 168  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 170  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 171  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 172  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 173  
families. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 176  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 177  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 178  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 179  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 180  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 181  
destination. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 183  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 184  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 185  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 186  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 187

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 188  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 189  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 190  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 191  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 192  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 193  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 194

cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 195  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 196  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 197  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 199  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 200  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 203  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 204  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 205  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 206  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 207  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 208  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 209  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 210  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 211  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 212  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 213  
under this section. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 216  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 217  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 218  
programs. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 221  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 222  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 223



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in

Ohio and for educational programs.	284
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.	285 286 287 288 289
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of America. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 316  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 317  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 318  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 319  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 320  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 322  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 323  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 324  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 325  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 326  
in the line of duty. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 328  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 329  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 330  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 331  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 334  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 335  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 336  
families. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 339  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 340  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 341

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 342  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 343  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 344  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 345  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 346  
participating in that program. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 349  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 350  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 353  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 354  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 355  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 358  
Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 359  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 360  
Cleveland, Ohio. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 363  
Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in 364  
whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 365  
resides. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 368  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 369  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 370

4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 371  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 374  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 375  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 376  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 377  
rotary foundation. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 380  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 381  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 382  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 385  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 386  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 389  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 390  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 391  
connection. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 394  
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 395  
research projects. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397  
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 398  
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 399

contributions solely to promote and support the historical 400  
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 401  
state. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403  
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 404  
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 405  
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 406  
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408  
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 409  
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 410  
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 411  
providing services to the school district's students that assist 412  
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 413  
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 414  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 415  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 416  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 417  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 418  
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 419  
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 420  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 421  
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 422  
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 423  
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 424  
training in providing such services to the students of the 425  
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 426  
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 427  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 428  
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 429  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the Canton city school district. The district may use the contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of district employees. 431  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. The school principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the contributions it receives for any other purpose. 437  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.877 of the Revised Code to the 460  
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Independence local school district. The school district shall 462  
use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs 463  
in providing services to the school district's students that 464  
assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional 465  
well-being of the students. The services provided may include 466  
bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 467  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 468  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 469  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 470  
district superintendent or, in the school district 471  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 472  
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 473  
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 474  
services. The school district also may use the contributions it 475  
receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 476  
district to receive training in providing such services to the 477  
students of the school district. The school district shall 478  
ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 479  
district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 480  
501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 481  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 482  
purpose. 483

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 484  
receives pursuant to section 4503.89 of the Revised Code to the 485  
American red cross of greater Columbus on behalf of the Ohio 486  
chapters of the American red cross, which shall use the 487  
contributions for disaster readiness, preparedness, and response 488  
programs on a statewide basis. 489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 490  
receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the 491  
nationwide children's hospital foundation. 492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the money to support transportation programs, provide training to school transportation professionals, and support other initiatives for school transportation safety.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St. Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. The school principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the contributions it receives for any other purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.903 of the Revised Code to the

Brecksville-Broadview Heights city school district. The school 524  
district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 525  
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 526  
district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 527  
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 528  
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 529  
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 530  
counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 531  
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 532  
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 533  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 534  
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 535  
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 536  
services. The school district also may use the contributions it 537  
receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 538  
district to receive training in providing such services to the 539  
students of the school district. The school district shall 540  
ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 541  
district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 542  
501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 543  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 544  
purpose. 545

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 546  
receives pursuant to section 4503.904 of the Revised Code to the 547  
Chagrin Falls exempted village school district. The school 548  
district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 549  
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 550  
district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 551  
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 552  
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 553  
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 554

counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 555  
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 556  
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 557  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 558  
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 559  
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 560  
services. The school district also may use the contributions it 561  
receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 562  
district to receive training in providing such services to the 563  
students of the school district. The school district shall 564

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 570  
pursuant to section 4503.92 of the Revised Code to support our 571  
troops, incorporated, a national nonprofit corporation, which 572  
shall use those contributions in accordance with its articles of 573  
incorporation and for the benefit of servicemembers of the armed 574  
forces of the United States and their families when they are in 575  
financial need. 576

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 577  
receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 578  
Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 579  
solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 580  
driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 581  
boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 582  
vocational school districts. 583

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 584

receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 585  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 586  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 587  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 588

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 589  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 590  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 591  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 592  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 593

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 594  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 595  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 596  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 597  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 598  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 599  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 600  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 601

Sec. 4503.872. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 602  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 603  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 604  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 605  
and issuance of "Canton Bulldogs" license plates. 606

The application may be combined with a request for a 607  
special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 608  
of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 609  
and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of 610  
this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 611  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Canton Bulldogs" 612  
license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker 613  
alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 614

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 615  
inscribed on the license plates, "Canton Bulldogs" license 616  
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by 617  
representatives of the Canton city school district that are 618  
approved by the registrar. "Canton Bulldogs" license plates 619  
shall display county identification stickers that identify the 620  
county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the 621  
Revised Code. 622

(B) "Canton Bulldogs" license plates and a validation 623  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 624  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 625  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 626  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 627  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 628  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 629  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 630  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 631  
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 632  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 633  
vehicles. 634

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 635  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 636  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty 637  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 638  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 639  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 640

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 641  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau 642  
for additional services required in the issuing of "Canton 643  
Bulldogs" license plates, into the state treasury to the credit 644

of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in section 645  
4501.06 of the Revised Code. 646
