A BILL

To amend sections 5103.031 and 5103.032 and to	1
enact sections 5103.037 and 5103.0310 of the	2
Revised Code regarding foster caregiver training	3
and foster home assessor requirements.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5103.031 and 5103.032 be amended	5
and sections 5103.037 and 5103.0310 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 5103.031. Except as provided in section 5103.033 of	8
the Revised Code, the department of job and family services may	9
not issue a certificate under section 5103.03 of the Revised	10
Code to a foster home unless the prospective foster caregiver	11
successfully completes the following amount of preplacement	12
training through a preplacement training program approved by the	13
department of job and family services under section 5103.038 of	14
the Revised Code or preplacement training provided under	15
division (B) of section 5103.30 of the Revised Code:	16
(A) If the foster home is a family foster home, at least	17
thirty-six-twenty-one_hours;	18

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(B) If the foster home is a specialized foster home, at	19
least thirty-six twenty-one hours.	20
Sec. 5103.032. (A) Except as provided in divisions (C),	21
(D), and (E) of this section and in section 5103.033 of the	22
Revised Code and subject to division (B) of this section, the	23
department of job and family services may not renew a foster	24
home certificate under section 5103.03 of the Revised Code	25
unless the foster caregiver successfully completes the following	26
amount of continuing training in accordance with the foster	27
caregiver's needs assessment and continuing training plan	28
developed and implemented under section 5103.035 of the Revised	29
Code:	30
(1) If the foster home is a family foster home, at least	31
forty-twenty hours in the preceding two-year period;	32
(2) If the foster home is a specialized foster home, at	33
least sixty thirty hours in the preceding two-year period.	34
The continuing training required by this section shall	35
comply with rules the department adopts pursuant to section	36
5103.0316 of the Revised Code.	37
(B) A foster caregiver may fulfill up to twenty per cent	38
of the required amount of continuing training described in	39
division (A) of this section by teaching one or more training	40
classes for other foster caregivers or by providing mentorship	41
services to other foster caregivers. The department of job and	42
family services shall adopt rules in accordance with Chapter	43
119. of the Revised Code as necessary for the qualification of	44
foster caregivers to provide training or mentorship services to	45
other foster caregivers.	46
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(C) At the beginning of a foster caregiver's two-year

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certification period, a public children services agency, private 48 child placing agency, or private noncustodial agency acting as a 49 recommending agency for a foster caregiver holding a certificate 50 issued under section 5103.03 of the Revised Code for a family 51 foster home or specialized foster home may waive up to eight 52 hours of continuing training the foster caregiver is otherwise 53 required by division (A) of this section to complete in that 54 two-year certification period if all of the following apply: 55

(1) The foster caregiver has held a certificate issued
under section 5103.03 of the Revised Code for a family foster
home or specialized foster home for at least two years;
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(2) The foster caregiver has provided foster care for at least ninety days of the twelve months preceding the date the agency issues the waiver;

(3) The foster caregiver has not violated any requirements governing certification of foster homes during the twelve months preceding the date the agency issues the waiver;

(4) The foster caregiver has complied in full with the
needs assessment and continuing training plan developed for the
foster caregiver under section 5103.035 of the Revised Code for
the preceding certification period.

(D) Each recommending agency shall establish and implement 69 a policy regarding good cause for a foster caregiver's failure 70 to complete the continuing training in accordance with division 71 (A) of this section. If the foster caregiver complies with the 72 policy, as determined by the agency, the department may renew 73 the foster caregiver's foster home certificate. The agency shall 74 submit the policy to the department and provide a copy to each 75 foster home the agency recommends for certification or renewal. 76

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The policy shall include the following:

(1) What constitutes good cause, including documentedillness, critical emergencies, and lack of accessible trainingprograms;

(2) Procedures for developing a scheduled corrective action plan that provides for prompt completion of the continuing training;

(3) Procedures for recommending revocation of the foster home certificate if the foster caregiver fails to comply with the corrective action plan.

(E) A foster caregiver shall be given an additional amount of time within which the foster caregiver must complete the continuing training required under division (A) of this section in accordance with rules adopted by the department of job and family services if either of the following applies:

(1) The foster caregiver has served in active duty outside this state with a branch of the armed forces of the United States for more than thirty days in the preceding two-year period.

(2) The foster caregiver has served in active duty as a
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member of the Ohio organized militia, as defined in section
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5923.01 of the Revised Code, for more than thirty days in the
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preceding two-year period and that active duty relates to either
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an emergency in or outside of this state or to military duty in
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or outside of this state.

employed in the county sheriff's office may conduct a home study	105
of a family foster home or treatment foster home if:	106
(1) The study is conducted at the request of a public	107

private noncustodial agency to which the duty to inspect and	109
approve such a home has been delegated under section 5103.03 of	110
the Revised Code; and	111
(2) The sheriff or designee has completed training in	112

(B) The director of job and family services shall adopt	115
rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code	116
governing the training necessary for a sheriff or designee to	117
