To amend Section 733.67 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 733.67 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the	9
132nd General Assembly be amended and that Section 733.67 of Am.	10
Sub. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly be amended to codify	11
it as section 3313.617 of the Revised Code to read as follows:	12
Sec. 733.67 3313.617. Notwithstanding anything in the	13

Revised Code to the contrary, this section shall apply only to 14 students who are enrolled in a school district, community 15 school, STEM school, or chartered nonpublic school and who 16 entered ninth grade for the first time on or after July 1, 2014, 17 but prior to July 1, <u>2015</u> <u>2017</u>. This section does not apply to 18 any student who entered ninth grade for the first time prior to 19 July 1, 2014, or to any student who entered ninth grade for the 20 first time on or after July 1, 2015 2017. 21 (A) In lieu of qualifying for high school graduation under 22 section 3313.61 of the Revised Code, a student to whom this 23 <u>section applies</u> shall be eligible to receive a high school 24 diploma if: 25 (1) The student takes all of the end-of-course 26 examinations prescribed under division (B)(2) of section 27 3301.0712 of the Revised Code required for the student or takes 28 the assessment prescribed under section 3313.619 of the Revised 29 Code, as applicable; 30 (2) Retakes, at least once, any end-of-course examination 31 in the area of English language arts or mathematics for which a 32 student received an equivalent score of lower than "3"; 33 (3) Completes the required units of instruction prescribed 34 by the school district or school; 35 (4) Meets at least two of the following conditions: 36 (a) The student has an attendance rate of at least ninety-37 three per cent during the twelfth grade year. 38 (b) The student takes at least four full-year or 39 equivalent courses during the twelfth grade year and has at 40 least a grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale for the 41 courses completed during the twelfth grade year. 42 (c) During the twelfth grade, the student completed a 43 capstone project as defined by the district or school. 44 (d) During the twelfth grade, the student completed one 45 hundred twenty hours of work in a community service role or in a 46 position of employment, including internships, work study, co-47

ops, and apprenticeships as defined by the district or school.	48
(e) The student earned three or more transcripted credit	49
hours under the College Credit Plus <u>college</u> credit plus p rogram,	50
established under Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code, at any time	51
during high school.	52
(f) The student passed an Advanced Placement advanced	53
<u>placement</u> or International Baccalaureate <u>international</u>	54
baccalaureate course, and received a score of three or higher on	55
the corresponding Advanced Placement advanced placement	56
examination or a score of four or higher on the corresponding	57
International Baccalaureate international baccalaureate	58
examination, at any time during high school.	59
(g) The student earned at least a level three score on	60
each of the "reading for information," "applied mathematics,"	61
and "locating information" components of the job skills	62
assessment selected by the State Board <u>state board</u> of Education	63
education under division (G) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised	64
Code, or a comparable score on similar components of an	65
successor version of that assessment.	66
(h) The student obtained an industry-recognized	67
credential, as described under division (B)(2)(d) of section	68
3302.03 of the Revised Code, or a group of credentials equal to	69
at least three total points.	70
(i) The student satisfies the conditions required to	71
receive an OhioMeansJobs-readiness seal under section 3313.6112	72
of the Revised Code.	73
(B) In lieu of qualifying for high school graduation under	74
section 3313.61 of the Revised Code, a student to whom this	75
section applies shall be eligible to receive a high school	76

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diploma if: 77 (1) The student takes all of the end-of-course 78 examinations prescribed under division (B)(2) of section 79 3301.0712 of the Revised Code required for the student or takes 80 the assessment prescribed under section 3313.619 of the Revised 81 82 Code, as applicable; (2) Completes the required units of instruction prescribed 83 by the school district or school; 84 85 (3) Completes a career-technical training program approved by the **Department** department of **Education** that 86 includes at least four career-technical courses; 87 (4) Meets one of the following conditions: 88 (a) Attains a cumulative score of at least proficient on 89 career-technical education assessments, or test modules, that 90 are required for a career-technical education program; 91 (b) Obtains an industry-recognized credential, as 92 described under division (B)(2)(d) of section 3302.03 of the 93 Revised Code, or a group of credentials equal to at least twelve 94 points; 95 (c) Demonstrates successful workplace participation, as 96 evidenced by documented completion of two hundred fifty hours of 97 workplace experience and evidence of regular, written, positive 98 evaluations from the workplace employer or supervisor and a 99 representative of the school district or school. The workplace 100 participation shall be based on a written agreement signed by 101 the student, a representative of the district or school, and an 102 employer or supervisor. 103

(C) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a student to

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whom this section applies from qualifying for a high school	105
diploma under section 3313.618 of the Revised Code if the	106
student meets the conditions prescribed by that section.	107

<u>(D)</u> As used in this section, "community school" means any	108
community school established under Chapter 3314. and "STEM	109
school" means any science, technology, engineering, and	110
mathematics school established under Chapter 3326. of the	111
