	require the application of fertilizer in the	3
	western Lake Erie basin to be applied onto an	4
	actively farmed field at the agronomic rate, and	5
	to require the application of manure in the	6
	western Lake Erie basin to be applied onto an	7
	actively farmed field at either the agronomic	8
	rate or while utilizing specified best available	9
	technologies.	10

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 905.326 and 939.08 be amended and	11
section 939.99 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	12
follows:	13
Sec. 905.326. (A) (1) Except as provided in division (B) of	14
this section, no No person in the western basin shall recklessly	15
surface apply fertilizer under either any of the following	16
circumstances:	17
(a) On snow-covered or frozen soil:	1.8

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(b) When the top two inches of soil are saturated from	19
precipitation <u>;</u>	20
(c) For agricultural purposes unless the person applies	21
the fertilizer onto an actively farmed field at the agronomic	22
<u>rate</u> .	23

(2) Except as provided in division (B) of this section, no	24
No person in the western basin shall <u>recklessly</u> surface apply	25
fertilizer <u>for agricultural purposes</u> in a granular form when the	26
local weather forecast for the application area contains greater	27
than a fifty per cent chance of precipitation exceeding one inch-	28
in a twelve-hour the twenty-four-hour period following the	29
planned application.	30
(B) Division (A) of this section does not apply if a	31
person in the western basin applies fertilizer under any of the	32

planned to be planted immediately following the current crops;	91

of the fertilizer as determined by a soil test taken within the	93

Sec. 939.08. (A) Except as provided in division (B) of	101
this section, no person in the western basin shall surface apply	102
manure under any of the following circumstances:	103
(1) On snow-covered or frozen soil;	104
(2) When the top two inches of soil are saturated from	105
precipitation;	106
(3) When the local weather forecast for the application	107
area contains greater than a fifty per cent chance of	108
precipitation exceeding one half inch in a twenty four hour the	109
forty-eight-hour period following the planned application;	110
(4) Onto an actively farmed field for agricultural	111
purposes unless either of the following apply:	112
(a) The person applies the manure at the agronomic rate.	113
(b) The person maintains and uses an operational system	114
utilizing a best available technology for the treatment,	115
stabilization, separation, or nutrient removal of the person's	116

Sec. 939.99. Whoever recklessly violates division (A) or	198
(B) of section 939.08 of the Revised Code is guilty of a	199
misdemeanor of the third degree on a first offense, a	200
misdemeanor of the second degree on a second offense, and a	201
misdemeanor of the first degree on a third or subsequent	202
offense.	203
Section 2. That existing sections 905.326 and 939.08 of	204
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	205
