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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.714 of the Revised Code to create the "Ohio 2  
Association of Chiefs of Police" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.714 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11  
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 12  
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 13  
4503.528, 4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 14  
4503.551, 4503.552, 4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 15  
4503.561, 4503.562, 4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.566, 4503.576, 16

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 27  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 28

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 29  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 30  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 31  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 32  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 33  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 34  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 35  
other abortion-related activities. 36

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 37  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 38  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 39  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 40  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 41  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 42  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 43  
other money in that fund. 44

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 45  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 46  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 47  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 48

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the

contributions for its research and other programs. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 80  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 81  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 82  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 83

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 84  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 85  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 86  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 87  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 89  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 90  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 91  
contributions into its general account to be used for 92  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 93  
America foundation. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 96  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 97  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 98  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 102  
scholarships and other educational activities. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 105  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 106

contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 107  
that organization. 108

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 109  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 110  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 111  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 112  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 113  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 114  
scholarship fund. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 117  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 118  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 119  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 120  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 121  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 122  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 123  
funds as provided in this section. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128  
cyclists of all ages. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 131  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 132  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 133  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 134  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 135  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to

the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 197  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 198  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 199  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 200

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 201  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 202  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 203  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 204  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 205  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 206  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 207  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 208  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 209  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 210  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 213  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 216  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 217  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 218  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 219  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 220  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 221  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 222  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 223  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 224  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 225  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 226



under this section. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 228  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 229  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 230  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 231  
programs. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 233  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 234  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 235  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 238  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 239  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 240  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 243  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 244  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 245  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 246  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 247  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 248  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 249  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 250  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 251  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 252  
such payments are to be made. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 255

Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 256  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 257  
river watershed. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 260  
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 261  
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 264  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 265  
the money in support of the park. 266

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 267  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 268  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 269  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 270

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 271  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 272  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 273  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 274  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 275  
local beekeeping programs. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 278  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 279  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 280  
legends to inspire future leaders. 281

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 282  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 283  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 284

applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 285  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 286  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 287  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 288  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 289

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 290  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 291  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 292  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 293  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 294  
(G) of that section. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 297  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 298  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 299  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 300  
Ohio and for educational programs. 301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 302  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 303  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 304  
supporting cancer research. 305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 307  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 308  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 309  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 311  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 312  
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 313

America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 314  
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 315  
the girl scouts. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 318  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 319  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 320  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 322  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 323  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 324  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 326  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 327  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 328  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 329  
charitable purposes. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 332  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 333  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 334  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 337  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 338  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 339  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 340  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 341  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 343  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 344  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 345  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 346  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 347  
in the line of duty. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 349  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 350  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 351  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 352  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 354  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 355  
association of chiefs of police. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 358  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 359  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 360  
families. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 363  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 364  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 365  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 366  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 367  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 368  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 369  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 370  
participating in that program. 371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for purposes of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the

rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 401  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 402  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 403  
rotary foundation. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 406  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 407  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 408  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 411  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 412  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 415  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 416  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 417  
connection. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419  
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 420  
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 421  
contributions to distribute between the various historical 422  
societies and museums in Medina county. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424  
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 425  
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 426  
research projects. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428  
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 429

Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 430  
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 431  
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 432  
state. 433

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 434  
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 435  
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 436  
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 437  
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439  
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 440  
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 441  
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 442  
providing services to the school district's students that assist 443  
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 444  
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 445  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 446  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 447  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 448  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 449  
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 450  
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 451  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 452  
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 453  
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 454  
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 455  
training in providing such services to the students of the 456  
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 457  
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 458  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 459  
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 460



contributions it receives for any other purpose. 461

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 462  
receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 463  
Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 464  
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 465  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 466  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 467  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 468  
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 469  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 470  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 471  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 472  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 473  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 474  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 475  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 476  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 477  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 478  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 479  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 480  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 481  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 482  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 483  
purpose. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485  
receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. 486  
Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of 487  
Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 488  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 489  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 490  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 491

students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 492  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 493

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 743  
receives pursuant to section 4503.908 of the Revised Code to St. 744  
Xavier high school located in Springfield township in Hamilton 745  
county. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions 746  
it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The 747  
school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the 748  
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 749  
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 750  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 751  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 752  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 753  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 754  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 755

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 788

Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 790  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 791  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 792

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 793  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 794  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 795  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 796

section the investment income the fund earned the previous 797  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 798  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 799  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 800

Sec. 4503.714. (A) Any member or staff of the Ohio 801  
association of chiefs of police, or any spouse thereof, may 802  
apply to the registrar of motor vehicles for the registration of 803  
any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational 804  
vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar 805  
that the person owns or leases and for issuance of "Ohio 806  
Association of Chiefs of Police" license plates. The application 807  
may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 808  
plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. An 809  
applicant shall include with the application for registration 810  
such documentary evidence in support of the applicant's status 811  
as a member or staff of the Ohio association of chiefs of 812  
police, or spouse thereof, as the registrar may require. 813

Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance 814  
by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 815  
registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 816  
registration and a set of "Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police" 817  
license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker 818  
alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 819

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 820  
inscribed on the license plates, "Ohio Association of Chiefs of 821  
Police" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and 822  
words selected by representatives of the Ohio association of 823  
chiefs of police that are approved by the registrar. "Ohio 824  
Association of Chiefs of Police" license plates shall display 825  
county identification stickers that identify the county of 826

registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 827  
Code. 828

(B) "Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police" license plates 829  
and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be 830  
issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a 831  
motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license 832  
tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 833  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 834  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 835  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 836  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 837  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 838  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 839  
vehicles. 840

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 841  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 842  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of ten 843  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 844  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 845  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 846

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 847  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 848  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 849  
of "Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police" license plates, into 850  
the state treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway 851  
purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 852

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 853  
Code is hereby repealed. 854
