Dear Chairman Steve Hambley and Members of the House Civil Justice Committee,

HB 369 should be opposed. This bill is not an equality act or fair. It would threaten not only women's equality but their safety and security forcing both women and girls to share private, intimate spaces with men who say they identify as female. It would deny women and girls fair competion in sports. It would force Americans to participate in events and speak messages that violate their core beliefs. It would make disagreement a discrimination violation punishable by law. Disagreement is not discrimination.
