Re: Opposition to HB 178, the "Permitless Carry" Bill

Dear Legislators,

My name is Laura Irvin and I live in Lorain County.

I am asking you to vote NO on HB 178. This bill will put Ohioans in danger by making it legal for a person with absolutely no gun safety training to carry a hidden, loaded handgun in public. Research shows that states that enact permitless carry laws have seen a substantial increase in the rate of aggravated assaults. Since Arizona enacted a permitless carry law in 2010, the rate of aggravated assaults committed with a firearm in the state increased by 39 percent by 2017. That increase represents 1,797 more gun related aggravated assaults committed in 2017 than in 2010. Evidence shows that states like Missouri and Alaska have also seen substantial increase in firearm violence. This is not the Ohio that I want for my children, neighbors or for myself.

I am also concerned that this bill allows for certain criminals who have been convicted of violent misdemeanors to be allowed to carry hidden loaded handguns throughout Ohio. Under current law, concealed carry applicants who have been convicted of these crimes must be denied. Violent criminals being legally allowed to hide loaded guns and walk around our neighborhoods! This is not the Ohio that I want for my children, neighbors or for myself.

If this law is enacted, some offenders convicted of crimes that involved possession, use or sale of illegal drugs would be allowed to hide loaded guns on their person and stroll through our cities and towns. Do you really want these offenders carrying concealed guns in our communities? This is not the Ohio that I want for my children, neighbors or for myself.

I value our sheriffs and police, and I value their lives. HB 178 would put these officers in more dangerous situations, and that is unconscionable. This is not the Ohio that I want for my children, neighbors or for myself.

Again, I am asking Ohio legislators to vote No on HB 178. I hope that I can count on you to keep our communities safe, and keep Ohio the state that we want for our children and neighbors.
