To Whom It May Concern:

Our organizations advocate for and work toward a future where all people have an equal opportunity to live a healthy, productive life. It is with this goal in focus that we support health education standards for K-12 students in Ohio.

Ohio is the <u>only</u> state in the country that does not have health education academic standards,¹ despite schools being uniquely poised to deliver cost-effective and life-saving education. Standards would offer a baseline for the skills and understanding students must learn to adequately navigate the many public health concerns that face Ohioans today.

From opioid addiction to teen suicide, Ohio's communities are facing preventable health crises. One specific health concern of our organizations is the increasing rates of early-onset diet related disease. Over 33% of Ohio's children have enough excess weight to put them at risk of developing early onset diet-related diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, heart disease, arthritis, and some cancers.² Additionally, diet-related disease is creating significant strain on Ohio's economy. The cost of healthcare required to treat diet-related disease in Ohio is estimated at \$6.36 billion.³

We must look toward holistic solutions that can both prevent and reduce diet-related disease. Health education standards are a fundamental piece of any such solution.

Public health heroes like yourself can help generate positive health outcomes and state-wide change. Thank you for leading the way in uplifting Ohio's children by supporting health education standards.
