

INTERESTED PARTY WRITTEN TESTIMONY ON H.B. 166 Senate Finance Committee - June 5, 2019

Chair Dolan, Vice Chair Burke, Ranking Minority Leader Sykes and Finance Committee Members:

Thank you for the opportunity to express our positions on proposals in House Bill 166 as passed by the Ohio House. AGC of Ohio represents commercial construction companies. Our members build and renovate vertical structures such as schools, manufacturing facilities, office buildings, apartments and dormitories, parking structures, utility and wastewater treatment plants, etc.

STRUCTURAL STEEL WELDING (R.C. 3781.40-44, 3781.02, 3781.06, 3781.061, 3781.10):

AGC of Ohio supports the Senate amending the language to clarify that the contractor performing the structural steel welding is responsible and removing the sections that would create a new bureaucracy under Industrial Compliance (see attached amendment 133HB166-SC3687). AGC of Ohio worked with the proponents of the structural steel welding proposal to develop the language contained in the amendment.

The House-passed version is problematic because:

- (1) It is vague as to who is responsible for assuring the structural steel welding is done properly; under the House-passed version, that responsibility could fall to a contractor that does not directly hire structural steel welders nor who has the qualifications or knowledge to ensure that structural steel welds are done properly.
- (2) It would create a bureaucracy that could slow down building inspections and construction projects.

The amendment addresses those concerns. It would essentially codify structural steel standards under Ohio Building Code that are required under a project's specifications, as well as add some recourse when those directly responsible for structural steel welds flagrantly disregard their responsibilities (i.e. falsify welding certifications).



MENTORSHIP PROGRAM (R.C. 4109.22 and 4109.00):

AGC of Ohio supports the current language of the mentorship program contained in H.B. 166 that limits it to manufacturing; we encourage the Senate to keep that language. The executive proposal included construction, and AGC of Ohio in conjunction with several other industry groups, opposed the inclusion of construction. A construction jobsite is vastly different than a manufacturing facility; and the proposal did not adequately address the industry's unique considerations related to the safety of the mentee (minor) and others on the jobsite, impact of insurance and bonding coverage for the contractor employing the minor and other employers on the jobsite, and potential liability for the project owner and other contractors.

DIVISION OF INDUSTRIAL COMPLIANCE: BUILDING CODE (R.C. 121.083 and 3781.10)

AGC of Ohio supports the language that authorizes the Superintendent of the Division of Industrial Compliance to administer and enforce the building code on behalf of political subdivisions or health districts, pursuant to contract. This will give local building departments an optional tool to help address any staffing issues and help ensure efficient plan review and timely building code inspections.

45	Structural steel welding standards
46 47	R.C. 3781.40, 3781.06, 3781.061, and 3781.10 and R.C. 3781.03, 3781.41, 3781.42, 3781.43, and 3781.44 (removed)
48 49 50	Requires a construction manager, rather than a project manager as under the House-passed version, to ensure compliance with the bill's proposed structural steel welding standards.
51 52 53 54	Allows a welder who must be American Welding Society (AWS) certified under the bill's proposed welding standards to be certified by an AWS certified individual, in addition to an AWS certified facility as under the House-passed version.
55 56 57 58 59	Eliminates a proposed requirement that the Superintendent of Industrial Compliance certify municipal, township, and county building departments or private third parties to inspect construction projects to determine that the welding complies with the bill's proposed welding standards.
60 61 62	Removes a proposed requirement that the Superintendent adopt rules for the purpose of implementing and administering the bill's proposed welding standards.
