BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 122.178, 122.179, and 122.1710 of	7
the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 122.178. (A) As used in this section and section	9
122.179 of the Revised Code, "microcredential" means a	10
certificate program or other industry-recognized credential that	11
the chancellor of higher education includes on the inventory	12
created under section 3333.94 of the Revised Code and that an	13
applicant may complete in not more than one year.	14
(B) There is hereby created the TechCred program to	15
reimburse eligible employers from appropriations made for that	16
purpose for training costs for incumbent or prospective	17
employees to earn a microcredential. The development services	18
agency, in consultation with the governor's office of workforce	1 (

develop the program.	21
(C)(1) An employer shall meet all of the following	22
requirements to be eliqible to participate in the program:	23
(a) Be registered to do business in this state;	24
(b) Be current on all tax obligations to the state;	25
(c) Be in compliance with all environmental regulations	26
applicable to the employer.	27
(2) An eligible employer may only apply for reimbursement	28
for training costs for incumbent or prospective employees who	29
are residents of this state.	30
(D)(1) Each employer seeking reimbursement for training	31
costs for an incumbent or prospective employee shall submit an	32
application to the director of development services that	33
includes all of the following information for each employee:	34
(a) The employee's name and position at the time of	35
submitting the application or the position for which the	36
employee will be qualified after earning the microcredential;	37
(b) The training provider from which the employee received	38
the training;	39
(c) The cost incurred by the employer for the training;	40
(d) Evidence that the employee earned a microcredential;	41
(e) Either of the following, as applicable:	42
(i) If the employee is an incumbent employee, evidence	43
that the employer has increased the employee's annual wage by at	44
least double the amount of the reimbursement the employer	45
requested for that employee on the employee's completion of the	46

microcredential;	47
(ii) If the employee at the time of receiving the training	48
was a prospective employee, evidence that the employer hired the	49
employee for a position located in this state on the employee's	50
completion of the microcredential.	51
(2) The director shall approve applications for	52
reimbursement based on the priority guidelines established in	53
division (E)(2) of this section. The director shall calculate	54
the amount of a reimbursement as the total amount of the costs	55
for all employees receiving the training. An employer shall	56
receive at least five hundred dollars but not more than two	57
thousand dollars for each microcredential an employee receives.	58
(E) The director shall do all of the following regarding	59
the operation of the program:	60
(1) Create a reimbursement application;	61
(2) Establish guidelines for prioritizing approval for	62

applications for reimbursement, including the efficiency of a	
wage increase for an incumbent employee or expected wage for a	64
<pre>prospective employee;</pre>	65
(3) Establish additional requirements for employers to be	66
eligible for a reimbursement under this section;	67
(4) Create an internet web site with the application for	68
and information regarding the program created in this section	69
and the grant program created in section 122.179 of the Revised	70

(F) The director, in consultation with the chancellor, may	72
adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code	73
as the director considers necessary to administer the program,	74

including designating eligible training providers for purposes	75
of this section and section 122.179 of the Revised Code.	76
Sec. 122.179. (A) As used in this section, "OhioMeansJobs_	77
web site" has the same meaning as in section 6301.01 of the	78
Revised Code.	79
(B) The individual microcredential assistance program is	80
hereby created in the development services agency to provide	81
grants to eligible individuals to pay for the costs of training	82
to earn a microcredential.	83
(C) (1) An individual may apply to the director of	84
development services for a grant under the program. The	85
individual shall include all of the following information in the	86
<pre>application:</pre>	87
(a) The microcredential that the individual is receiving	88
<pre>training to earn;</pre>	89
(b) The training provider from which the individual is	90
receiving training;	91
(c) The cost of the training.	92
(2) The director shall make the grant application	93
available on the OhioMeansJobs web site and the internet web	94
sites maintained by the development services agency, the	95
governor's office of workforce transformation, and the	96
departments of higher education and education.	97
(D) The maximum amount of a grant awarded under the	98
program is five thousand dollars. If the director approves the	99
grant application, the director shall disperse half of the	100
amount of a grant to the training provider identified in the	101
application on behalf of the individual who applied before the	102

beginning of training. When the individual has completed half of	103
the training required to earn a microcredential, the training	104
provider shall submit evidence the individual has completed that	105
training and of the individual's enrollment in the remaining	106
training. The director shall disperse the remaining grant funds	107
on receiving the evidence.	108
(E) A training provider may seek to recover half of the	109
amount of the grant awarded to an individual under the program	110
if the individual fails to complete the training and earn a	111
microcredential from the provider. The provider may only recover	112
half of the grant amount from the individual, regardless of the	113
amount of the training the individual completed.	114
(F) The director may adopt rules under Chapter 119. of the	115
Revised Code as the director considers necessary to implement	116

(1) "Industry sector partnership" means a collaborative	119
relationship between one or more employers and one or more of	120
