BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4513.35 and 4513.39 of the	7	
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8	
Sec. 4513.35. (A) All fines collected under sections	9	
4511.01 to 4511.78, 4511.99, and 4513.01 to 4513.37 of the	10	
Revised Code shall be paid into the county treasury and, with	11	
the exception of that portion distributed under section 307.515	12	
of the Revised Code, shall be placed to the credit of the fund		
for the maintenance and repair of the highways within that		
county, except that:	15	
(1) All fines for violations of division (B) of section	16	

4513.263 shall be delivered to the treasurer of state as 17 provided in division (E) of section 4513.263 of the Revised 18 Code. 19

(2) All fines collected from, or moneys arising from bonds forfeited by, persons apprehended or arrested by state highway patrol troopers shall be distributed as provided in section 5503.04 of the Revised Code.

(3) (a) Subject to division (E) of section 4513.263 of the
Revised Code and except as otherwise provided in division (A) (3)
(b) of this section, one-half of all fines collected from, and
(c) one-half of all moneys arising from bonds forfeited by, persons
(c) apprehended or arrested by a township constable or other
(c) to be placed to the credit of the general fund.

(b) All fines collected from, and all moneys arising from 31 bonds forfeited by, persons apprehended or arrested by a 32 township constable or other township police officer pursuant to 33 division (B)(2) or (C) of section 4513.39 of the Revised Code 34 for a violation of section 4511.21 of the Revised Code or any 35 other law, ordinance, or regulation pertaining to speed that 36 occurred on a highway that is part of the interstate system or 37 otherwise part of the national highway system, shall be paid 38 into the county treasury and be credited as provided in the 39 first paragraph of this section. 40

(B) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or of any other section of the Revised Code:

(1) All fines collected from, and all moneys arising from
bonds forfeited by, persons arrested under division (E) (1) or
(2) of section 2935.03 of the Revised Code are deemed to be

collected, and to arise, from arrests made within the46jurisdiction in which the arresting officer is appointed,47elected, or employed, for violations of one of the sections or48chapters of the Revised Code listed in division (E)(1) of that49section and shall be distributed accordingly.50

(2) All fines collected from, and all moneys arising from bonds forfeited by, persons arrested under division (E)(3) of section 2935.03 of the Revised Code are deemed to be collected, and to arise, from arrests made within the jurisdiction in which the arresting officer is appointed, elected, or employed, for violations of municipal ordinances that are substantially equivalent to one of the sections or one of the provisions of one of the chapters of the Revised Code listed in division (E) (1) of that section and for violations of one of the sections or one of the provisions of one of the chapters of the Revised Code listed in division (E)(1) of that section, and shall be distributed accordingly.

Sec. 4513.39. (A) The state highway patrol and sheriffs or 63 their deputies shall exercise, to the exclusion of all other 64 peace officers, except within municipal corporations and except 65 as specified in division divisions (B) and (C) of this section 66 and division (E) of section 2935.03 of the Revised Code, the 67 power to make arrests for violations on all state highways, of 68 sections 4503.11, 4503.21, 4511.14 to 4511.16, 4511.20 to 69 4511.23, 4511.26 to 4511.40, 4511.42 to 4511.48, 4511.58, 70 4511.59, 4511.62 to 4511.71, 4513.03 to 4513.13, 4513.15 to 71 4513.22, 4513.24 to 4513.34, 4549.01, 4549.08 to 4549.12, and 72 4549.62 of the Revised Code. 73

a joint police district created under section 505.482 of the 76 Revised Code, and a township constable appointed pursuant to 77 section 509.01 of the Revised Code, who has received a 78 certificate from the Ohio peace officer training commission 79 under section 109.75 of the Revised Code, shall exercise the 80 power to make arrests for violations of those sections listed in 81 division (A) of this section, other than sections 4513.33 and 82 4513.34 of the Revised Code, as follows: 83

(1) <u>If Except as specified in division (C) of this</u> <u>section, if</u> the population of the township that created the township or joint police district served by the member's police force or the township that is served by the township constable is fifty thousand or less <u>according to the most recent federal</u> <u>decennial census</u>, the member or constable shall exercise that power on those portions of all state highways, including those highways that are part of the national highway system but that are not part of the interstate system, that are located within the township or joint police district, in the case of a member of a township or joint police district police force, or within the unincorporated territory of the township, in the case of a township constable7.

97 (2) If the population of the township that created the township or joint police district served by the member's police 98 force or the township that is served by the township constable 99 is greater than fifty thousand according to the most recent 100 federal decennial census, the member or constable shall exercise 101 that power on those portions of all state highways, including 102 any highway that is a part of the interstate highway system or 103 otherwise a part of the national highway system, that are 104 located within the township or joint police district, in the 105 case of a member of a township or joint police district police 106
