## A BILL

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5167.12 be amended and sections	6
3902.50, 3902.51, and 5164.7516 of the Revised Code be enacted	7
to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3902.50. As used in sections 3902.50 and 3902.51 of the Revised Code:	9 10
(A) "Cost sharing" means the cost borne by a person	11
covered under a health benefit plan according to any coverage	12
limit, copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or other out-of-	13
pocket expense requirements imposed by the plan.	14
(B) "Covered person," "health benefit plan," and "health plan issuer" have the same meanings as in section 3922.01 of the <u>Revised Code.</u>	15 16 17
<u>(C) "State of emergency" means a state of emergency</u>	18

declared by the governor in an executive order.	19	
Sec. 3902.51. (A) A health benefit plan that provides	20	
coverage for prescription drugs shall, during any state of	21	
emergency, cover a prescribed ninety-day supply of covered drugs	22	
dispensed under section 4729.40 of the Revised Code.	23	
(B) A health plan issuer shall not impose any cost-sharing	24	
requirement for coverage provided under division (A) of this	25	
section that is proportionally greater than the cost-sharing	26	
requirement for a standard supply of the prescription.

(C) Nothing in this section shall be construed as doing	28

Sec. 5164.7516. (A) As used in this section, "state of	35	
emergency" has the same meaning as in section 3902.50 of the	36	
Revised Code.		
(B) The department of medicaid shall, during any state of	38	
emergency, cover a ninety-day supply of a prescribed drug	39	
dispensed under section 4729.40 of the Revised Code.	40	
(C) The department shall not impose any cost-sharing	41	
requirement for coverage provided under division (B) of this		
section that is proportionally greater than the cost-sharing	43	
requirement established under section 5162.20 of the Revised	44	
Code for a standard supply of the prescribed drug.	45

Sec. 5167.12. If prescribed drugs are included in the care	54
management system:	55
(A) Medicaid MCO plans may include strategies for the	56
management of drug utilization, but any such strategies are	57
subject to the limitations and requirements of this section and	58
the approval of the department of medicaid.	59
(B) A medicaid MCO plan shall not impose a prior	60
authorization requirement in the case of a drug to which all of	61
the following apply:	
(1) The drug is an antidepressant or antipsychotic.	63
(2) The drug is administered or dispensed in a standard	64
tablet or capsule form, except that in the case of an	65
antipsychotic, the drug also may be administered or dispensed in	66
a long-acting injectable form.	67
(3) The drug is prescribed by any of the following:	68
(a) A physician whom the medicaid managed care	69
organization that offers the plan allows to provide care as a	70
psychiatrist through its credentialing process;	
(b) A psychiatrist who is practicing at a location on	72

mental health services are certified by the department of mental 74
health and addiction services under section 5119.36 of the 75

(c) A certified nurse practitioner, as defined in section
4723.01 of the Revised Code, who is certified in psychiatric
mental health by a national certifying organization approved by
the board of nursing under section 4723.46 of the Revised Code;

(d) A clinical nurse specialist, as defined in section
4723.01 of the Revised Code, who is certified in psychiatric
mental health by a national certifying organization approved by

the board of nursing under section 4723.46 of the Revised Code.

(4) The drug is prescribed for a use that is indicated on the drug's labeling, as approved by the federal food and drug administration.

(C) The department shall authorize a medicaid MCO plan to include a pharmacy utilization management program under which prior authorization through the program is established as a condition of obtaining a controlled substance pursuant to a prescription.

(D) Each medicaid managed care organization and medicaid

MCO plan shall comply with sections 5164.091, 5164.7511,

if the organization were the department and the plan were the

Section 2. That existing section 5167.12 of the Revised Code is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Sections 3902.50 and 3902.51 of the Revised100Code as enacted by this act shall apply to health benefit plans,101as that term is defined in section 3922.01 of the Revised Code,102

in effect on the effective date of this section. Those sections 103
shall also apply to all health benefit plans issued, amended, or 104
renewed on or after the effective date of this section. 105

Section 5167.12 of the Revised Code as amended by this act 106 and sections 3902.50, 3902.51, and 5164.7516 of the Revised Code 107 as enacted by this act shall apply to the state of emergency 108 declared by Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, 109 to protect the well-being of Ohio citizens from the dangerous 110 effects of COVID-19. 111

Section 4. This act is an emergency measure necessary for112the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and113safety. The reason for such necessity is to provide patients114access to necessary medications while minimizing their exposure115to COVID-19. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect.116
