A BILL

To waive certain Medicaid requirements during the	1
COVID-19 emergency declaration and to declare an	2
emergency.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

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1320b-5, as necessary to do all of the following with respect to 18
the Medicaid program during the period of the emergency declared 19
by Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, due to 20
COVID-19: 21

(a) Expand financial eligibility to three hundred per centof the federal poverty line for children and two hundred percent of the federal poverty line for adults;

(b) Suspend any required actions a provider must take with respect to the Medicaid program or with respect to a license or provider agreement;

(c) Suspend any facility requirements relating to
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infection screening and testing, such as occupancy limits or
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staffing ratios;
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(d) Permit health care providers licensed in other statesto provide medical services to Medicaid recipients in this statewithout additional license requirements;

(e) Suspend any prior authorization requirements for
 Medicaid services, including those established by Medicaid
 managed care organizations;
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(f) Suspend the preadmission screening and annual resident
review as required under sections 5123.021 and 5165.03 of the
Revised Code;

(g) Not implement the requirements of section 5166.37 of
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the Revised Code and not implement the Medicaid waiver component
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granted by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on
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March 15, 2019, and entitled "Ohio Group VIII Work Requirement
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and Community Engagement Section 1115 Demonstration";

(h) Suspend any requirements that a Medicaid recipient

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take action to maintain continued eligibility for the Medicaid 46 program and invoke all available exceptions to timeliness 47 standards for renewing Medicaid eligibility; 48 (i) Implement presumptive eligibility to the maximum 49 extent authorized under federal law, including by: 50 (i) Expanding presumptive eligibility to cover additional 51 optional eligibility groups, including justice-involved 52 individuals; 53 (ii) Suspending any existing restrictions on presumptive 54 eligibility that are optional or permissive under federal law, 55 including the restriction that an individual is ineligible for a 56 subsequent presumptive coverage period for twelve months 57 beginning on the date of a presumptive coverage determination. 58 (j) Suspend any copayment requirements established under 59 section 5162.20 of the Revised Code; 60 (k) Authorize payment for Medicaid services provided by a 61 home health agency at the time the services are ordered by a 62 physician, rather than when the services are provided. 63 (2) To the extent that any of the actions described in 64 division (B)(1) of this section conflict with any provision of 65 the Revised Code, such provision of the Revised Code is 66 suspended during the period of the emergency described in that 67 division. 68 Section 2. Section 5162.70 of the Revised Code is 69 suspended during the period of the emergency declared by 70 Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, due to COVID-71 19. 72

Section 3. This act is an emergency measure necessary for

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the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and	74
safety. The reason for such necessity is to provide patients	75
access to Medicaid services under the Medicaid program with	76
minimal disruption during the COVID-19 outbreak. Therefore, this	77
act shall go into immediate effect.	78
