#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section, "health care	3
provider" has the same meaning as in section 3701.23 of the	4

Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, due to COVID-	7

(1)(a) In addition to reporting the existence of COVID-19	9
as required by actions taken pursuant to division (B)(5) of	10
section 3701.23 of the Revised Code, boards of health, health	11
authorities or officials, health care providers, and coroners or	12
medical examiners shall promptly report to the Department of	13
Health each COVID-19 test that is administered, along with all	14
of the following:	15
(i) The date the test was administered:	16

(ii) The zip code of residence of the individual tested	17			
or, if unknown or not located in this state, the zip code of the	18			
location where the test was administered;	19			
(iii) Indication of whether the individual tested resides	20			
in a congregate setting, such as a nursing home, residential	21			
care facility, hospital, or prison and, if so, identification of	22			
the congregate setting.	23			
(b) A reporter under division (B)(1)(a) of this section	24			
shall promptly update its report to the Department with all of	25			
the following, to the extent the information is available to the	26			
reporter:	27			
(i) The results of the test, whether positive or negative,	28			
and the date the results were confirmed;	29			
(ii) If the reporter is a hospital, the date of admission	30			
to the hospital for the treatment of COVID-19 and the date of	31			
discharge or date of death, as applicable;	32			
(iii) Each death resulting from COVID-19, the date of the	33			
death, the age of the deceased, and whether the death was	34			
attributable solely to COVID-19 or there were additional	35			
complication factors, and, if there were, identification of the	36			
complication factors.	37			
(c) The reports required under divisions (B)(1)(a) and (b)	38			
of this section shall be submitted in the manner the Director of	39			
Health prescribes.	40			
(d) Information reported under divisions (B)(1)(a) and (b)	41			
of this section that is protected health information pursuant to	42			
section 3701.17 of the Revised Code shall be released only in	43			
accordance with that section.

(c) of this section shall include only confirmed cases of COVID-	79			
19, not cases that are probable or presumed. The Department	80			
shall separately release the information identified in divisions	81

presumed cases of COVID-19, and shall include the basis for	83			
determining the case to be probable or presumed.	84			
(e) When modeling projections related to COVID-19 are	85			
released by the Department, the Department shall release all	86			
supporting information and documents, including a margin of				
error. The Department shall release any adjustments to the	88
