BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, An imbalance of earning power exists in our	3
economy, where income for the bottom half of earners in the	4
United States increased by 1% from 1980 to 2014, while income	5
for the top 1% of earners increased by 205%; and	6
WHEREAS, When workers join or organize a union, they are	7
demonstrating the power of collective action as a countervailing	8
force for the benefit of their interests as working people; and	9
WHEREAS, Princeton University researchers, in a recent study	10
titled "Unions and Inequality Over the Twentieth Century: New	11
Evidence from Survey Data" published in the National Bureau of	12
Economic Research, found that over the past eight decades, union	13
membership consistently provided union workers with a 10% to 20%	14
higher wage than their non-union counterparts; and	15

WHEREAS, Unions are critical to increasing wages for workers	16
and reducing income inequality; and	17
WHEREAS, Current labor law does not provide sufficient	18
protections for workers who wish to organize with their co-	19
workers; and	20
WHEREAS, The Protecting the Right to Organize Act of 2019 is	21
comprehensive legislation designed to strengthen protections for	22
workers' rights to organize a union and bargain collectively for	23
higher wages, better benefits, and safer working conditions; and	24
WHEREAS, The Protecting the Right to Organize Act of 2019	25
removes barriers to organizing, reduces interference with the	26
election process by prohibiting required attendance at anti-	27
union meetings, and makes it easier for workers and employers to	28
negotiate an initial collective bargaining agreement by creating	29
a mediation and arbitration process; and	30
WHEREAS, The Protecting the Right to Organize Act of 2019	31
protects workers' right to strike for basic workplace	32
improvements by prohibiting the hiring of permanent replacements	33
for striking workers, and narrows the definition of independent	34
contractor to eliminate employee misclassification, which is a	35
common tactic used to avoid employee protections under the	36
National Labor Relations Act, such as the right to organize; and	37
WHEREAS, The Protecting the Right to Organize Act of 2019	38
establishes meaningful penalties for violations of workers'	39
rights under the National Labor Relations Act, and safeguards	40
workers' access to justice by authorizing a private right of	41
action for violations of workers' rights and fairer remedies for	42
workers who experience retaliation, discrimination, or other	43
interference with the right to act concertedly, join a union, or	44
bargain collectively; and	45
WHEREAS, The Protecting the Right to Organize Act of 2019	46
