

Beginning in the years following the Civil War the Buffalo Soldiers have been at service to the United States and its' citizens through both peace and war. Currently in Ohio Buffalo Soldiers MC's continue that service in communities throughout the state. With chapters in Toledo, Cleveland, Columbus and elsewhere Buffalo Soldiers continue to serve in ways very different from those early years.

Chapters in Ohio continued to reach out to their communities in 2020 despite the coronavirus pandemic which left so many social service agencies unable to reach their client base. In Toledo the Buffalo Soldiers teamed with the Lucas County Metropolitan Housing Authority to provide hot meals at not cost to residents on site. In Cleveland and Columbus the chapters collaborated with local Meals On Wheels programs to make sure seniors and shut ins continued to receive meals and in person visits. Other Ohio chapters stayed involved in their pet projects for Donate Life, veteran's outreach, and mentoring programs for youths.

Even during the pandemic Ohio chapters of The Buffalo Soldiers MC's were able to hold voter registration drives, census sign up events, vaccination clinics, and important signature programs like Toledo's "What To Do When Stopped By Police".

Buffalo Soldier MC's in Ohio have raised tens of thousands of dollars for local charities, touched the lives of thousands during the pandemic, and have done it all with volunteers and support from local communities.
