This is written testimony against House Bill 22. It is possible that you are so fully consumed by your duties to your constituent that you are unaware of what took place in Minneapolis, Minnesota on May 25, 2020. A man named George Floyd's life was wrongly taken in the streets by Officer Derrek Chauvin, an on duty police officer.
