House Bill 322 is progressive legislation will assure that in Ohio schools athletic boys cannot be denied the right to compete against athletic girls, in team sports or individual athletic events. House Bill 322 is progressive legislation will assure that in Ohio schools athletic girls cannot be denied the right to compete against athletic boys, in team sports or individual athletic events. School athletic coaches will be prohibited from granting graduation credit for courses involving physical performance which segregate, embarrass, or limit students by sex. This would include selection of partners in dance classes.

Under House Bill 322 Ohio will recognize that students of the male sex are not inherently superior in athletics and other physical performances. This House Bill is a due rebuke to testimony given by some, regarding other legislation in this General Assembly session.

Sec. 3313.6028. (A) No state agency, school district, or school shall teach, instruct, or train any administrator, teacher, staff, member, or employee to adopt or believe any of the following concepts:

(1) One race or sex is inherently superior to another race

or sex;

(B) No teacher or school administrator employed by a school district or employee of a state agency shall approve for use, make use of, or carry out standards, curricula, lesson plans, textbooks, instructional materials, or instructional practices that serve to inculcate the concepts described in divisions (A)(1) to (11) of this section.
