I feel that my home is the most devastated property in the project and I had no idea it was coming. I listened to experts testify that property values won't be affected by this project. You and I know better. I will make the last payment on my house in May 2021. Republic wind hopes to start construction at the same time. How would you feel to work your whole life, pay your mortgage on time and as soon as it's paid off watch the value sink by as much as 50% to 70% and your house be uninhabitable?

Please let me have my one vote on this issue. That is all I ask.
