Chairman Peterson, Vice Chair Schuring, Ranking Member Williams, and members of the Committee. My name is John Newland and I reside in Allen County. I write in support of HB 118 and would like to address my concerns that without the passage of this bill a state agency (Ohio Power Sitting Board) will override the will of the citizens.

I believe the citizens of the townships where solar panels and wind projects plan to locate should have a local vote on whether this is good for our community. The communities should decide if the promised economic benefits outweigh the safety risk they will be subjected too. At a minimum setback distances should be at least as far as the turbine manufacturers say is safe in case of fires or during thunderstorms. Why should a state agency have the say on the health and safety risk subjected to a community?

I have concerns for the local citizens not having a say in the restructuring of the areas we reside. Many families have lived in their communities for generations. Should they not have a voice in the decision if the economic benefits are greater then the lost property values of their communities by going from agriculture zoning to industrial against the local government's resolutions?
