RE: Opposition to Senate Bill 357

Chairman Matt Dolan, Vice Chair Gavarone, Ranking Member Sykes and members of the Senate Finance Committee, I offer this testimony in opposition to Senate Bill 357 sent on Monday afternoon, December 05, 2022.

This bill is an attack against all law-abiding citizens and should be rejected in its totality because it constitutes a vicious attack on the civil rights and freedoms of Ohioans to Keep and Bear Arms. This is nothing more than another attempt at Red Flag Gun Confiscation and will do nothing to prevent criminals from still doing what they are going to do anyway. If we aren't holding people accountable for the crimes that they have already committed, what good is another law that really only impacts lawabiding citizens?

This bill is nearly identical to Michael Bloomberg's Universal Gun Registration scheme. It arrogates power to the General Assembly to classify firearms as something for which is does not have the authority, and it further builds and expands the centralized database that an out-of-control government wants to use for future gun confiscation.

Understand that all Representatives have taken an oath to <u>protect our Constitutional rights</u>. They are NOT put in office to find new ways to take more of our rights away from us.
