Even though I am assigned to a failing school, I do not fit into the chart because I have always attended catholic elementary school. It is really hard for my family to afford tuition for me and my sister.

If I don't have enough money for tuition for a private, non-failing school, then my parents should be able to also apply for this scholarship, and not have to attend a failing school for even a quarter, to get a scholarship. Because the whole purpose of this scholarship is to have students be able to get a good education instead of having to attend a failing school.

Now I have moved to the failing middle school for the end of the year. I enrolled there because we can't afford private school for both of us, and this scholarship opportunity will allow me to continue going to my private school next year.

It is hard for a student to get pulled out of one school and into another where they have no idea what is going on. It is also hard to break contact from old friends and make new ones, only to have to lose contact with them after you get the scholarship and have to tell your old friends where you've been for the past year.
