Today I work as a Licensed Optician, Director of Operations for C-Mor Safety Inc. My job responsibility is to recruit Licensed Opticians in required states and unlicensed opticians in non-required states. Our company provides On-site industrial Health and Safety Opticians to fit prescription safety glasses at MFG companies all over the United States.

It is amazing to see how the unlicensed states opticians, do not understand HIPPA guide lines, Ansi Standards, MSDS and General Optician Responsibilities. Working in the plants you have to be highly skilled to insure the employees do not get fitted with the wrong frame material, lenses material and coatings. i.e. – do you know that an electricians should not be fitted with a frame that has metal material? The standard is NFPA 70e. OSHA.

I am against HB509 and my above example is a great point on my Ohio needs to keep Licensed Opticians.
