## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

| The honor and remember flag's red field represents the           | 16 |

(B) The general assembly encourages the display of the27honor and remember flag during normal business hours at any28public building in the state, and at any location during a29military memorial service.30

(C) The honor and remember flag shall be displayed at the statehouse in Columbus on the last Monday in May, known as Memorial Day.

(D) The statehouse may comply with the requirements of34this section by commencing the display of the flag during normal35business hours on a workday before the required display day, and36ending the display during normal business hours on a workday37following the required display day.38

(E) When displayed from the same halyard or staff, the39honor and remember flag should fly below, and be not larger40than, the United States flag. When displayed from adjacent41staffs, the United States flag should always be placed to the42flag's own right of other flags, per 4 U.S.C. 7(f). When three43
