#### A BILL

То	amend section 4765.16 and to enact sections	1
	109.7410 and 4765.162 of the Revised Code to	2
	require emergency medical service personnel and	3
	peace officers to undergo dementia-related	4
	training.	5

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 4765.16 be amended and sections	6
109.7410 and 4765.162 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	7
follows:	8
Sec. 109.7410. (A) As used in this section, "dementia"	9
includes Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder.	10
(B) The attorney general, in consultation with the	11
departments of aging and job and family services, shall adopt,	12
in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code or pursuant	13
to section 109.74 of the Revised Code, rules governing the	14
training of peace officers in identifying and interacting with	15

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dementia, as provided in the dementia-related training course

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developed under section 4765.162 of the Revised Code.	72
(C) A training program for emergency medical technicians-	73
basic shall meet the standards established in rules adopted by	74
the board under section 4765.11 of the Revised Code. The program	75
shall include courses in each of the following areas for at	76
least the number of hours established by the board's rules:	77
(1) Emergency victim care;	78
(2) Reading and interpreting a trauma victim's vital	79
signs;	80
(3) Triage protocols for adult and pediatric trauma	81
victims;	82
(4) In-hospital training;	83
(5) Clinical training;	84
(6) Training as an ambulance driver <u>;</u>	85
(7) Identifying and interacting with individuals with	86

Each operator of a training program for emergency medical	89
technicians-basic shall allow any pupil in the twelfth grade in	90
a secondary school who is at least seventeen years old and who	91
otherwise meets the requirements for admission into such a	92
training program to be admitted to and complete the program and,	93
as part of the training, to ride in an ambulance with emergency	94
medical technicians-basic, emergency medical technicians-	95
intermediate, and emergency medical technicians-paramedic. Each	96

(F) A continuing education program for first responders,	136

include instruction and training in subjects established by the	140
board's rules for at least the number of hours established by	141
the board's rules. A continuing education program also shall	142
include instruction in identifying and interacting with	143
individuals with dementia, as provided in the dementia-related	144
training course developed under section 4765.162 of the Revised

Sec. 4765.162. (A) As used in this section, "dementia"	147
includes Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder.	148
(B) The state board of emergency medical, fire, and	149
transportation services, in consultation with the departments of	150
aging and job and family services, shall develop a dementia-	151
related training course to be included in all emergency medical	152
services training programs accredited under section 4765.15 of	153
the Revised Code and all emergency medical services continuing	
education programs approved under that section.	155
(C) The board shall adopt rules under section 4765.11 of	156

the Revised Code governing the dementia-related training course	157
developed under this section. The rules shall specify both of	158
<pre>the following:</pre>	159
(1) The amount of training, which shall be at least two	160
hours of instruction, that is necessary for satisfactory	161
completion of the dementia-related training course included in	162
an emergency medical services training program;	163
(2) The amount of training, which shall be at least one	164
hour of instruction, that is necessary for satisfactory	165
completion of the dementia-related training course included in	166
an emergency medical services continuing education program.	167
(D) The dementia-related training course developed under	168
this section shall include instruction in all of the following:	169
(1) Identifying individuals with dementia, including	170
psychiatric and behavioral symptoms of dementia and common	
medical emergencies experienced by individuals with dementia;	172
(2) Respectful and effective communication techniques for	173
communicating with individuals with dementia and their	174
<pre>caregivers;</pre>	175
(3) Techniques for addressing the behavioral symptoms of	176
dementia during the administration of emergency medical	177
<pre>treatment;</pre>	178
(4) Identifying and reporting incidents of abuse, neglect,	179
and exploitation of individuals with dementia to the appropriate	180
county department of job and family services in accordance with	
section 5101.63 of the Revised Code;	182
(5) Protocols for contacting caregivers when an individual	183
with domontia is found wandering or during an emergency or	1 0 /

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<pre>crisis situation;</pre>	185
(6) Local resources available for individuals with	186
<pre>dementia;</pre>	187
(7) Local and national organizations that assist emergency	188
medical service personnel with locating missing and wandering	189
individuals with dementia and returning them to their	190
