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**A BILL**

To amend sections 4501.21, 5533.04, and 5533.626 1  
and to enact sections 4503.507, 4503.516, 2  
4503.517, 4503.518, 4503.578, 4503.597, 3  
4503.703, 4503.755, 5534.409, 5534.414, 4  
5534.415, 5534.416, 5534.418, 5534.419, 5  
5534.431, 5534.432, 5534.433, 5534.603, 6  
5534.604, 5534.605, 5534.606, 5534.816, 7  
5534.819, 5534.828, 5534.837, 5534.838, 8  
5534.841, 5534.872, 5534.897, 5534.899, 9  
5534.912, and 5534.923 of the Revised Code to 10  
amend and designate multiple memorial highways 11  
and memorial bridges and to create multiple new 12  
specialty license plates. 13

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That sections 4501.21, 5533.04, and 5533.626 be 14  
amended and sections 4503.507, 4503.516, 4503.517, 4503.518, 15  
4503.578, 4503.597, 4503.703, 4503.755, 5534.409, 5534.414, 16  
5534.415, 5534.416, 5534.418, 5534.419, 5534.431, 5534.432, 17  
5534.433, 5534.603, 5534.604, 5534.605, 5534.606, 5534.816, 18  
5534.819, 5534.828, 5534.837, 5534.838, 5534.841, 5534.872, 19  
5534.897, 5534.899, 5534.912, and 5534.923 of the Revised Code 20  
be enacted to read as follows: 21

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 22  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 23  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 24  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 25  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 26  
in division (B) of this section. 27

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 28  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 31  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 32  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 33  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 34  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 35  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 36  
other abortion-related activities. 37

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 38  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 39  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 40  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 41  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 42  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 43

manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 44  
other money in that fund. 45

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 46  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 47  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 48  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 51  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 52  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 53  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 54  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 55  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 56  
directly to their clients. 57

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 58  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 59  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 60  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 61  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 62

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 63  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 64  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 65  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 66  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 68  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 69  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 70  
its research and other programs. 71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 72

receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 73  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 74  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 75

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 76  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 77  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 78  
contributions for its research and other programs. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 81  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 82  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 83  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 86  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 87  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 88  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 90  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 91  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 92  
contributions into its general account to be used for 93  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 94  
America foundation. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 97  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 98  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 99  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 100

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 101

pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 102  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 103  
scholarships and other educational activities. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 105  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 106  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 107  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 108  
that organization. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 110  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 111  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 112  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 113  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 115  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 116  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 117  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 118  
programming. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 120  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 121  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 122  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 123  
need. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 126  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 127  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 128

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 130

university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 131  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 132  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 133  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 134  
scholarship fund. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 137  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 138  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 139  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 140  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 141  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 142  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 143  
funds as provided in this section. 144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 146  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 147  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 148  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 149  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 150  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 151  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 152  
funds as provided in this section. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 155  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 156  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 157  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 158  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 159  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 160

university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 161  
funds as provided in this section. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 164  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 165  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 166

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 168  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 169  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 170  
cyclists of all ages. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 173  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 174  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 175  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 176  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 177  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 180  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 181  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 182  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 185  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 186  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 187  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189

receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 190  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 191  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 192  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 193  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 194  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 195  
sponsors within this state. 196

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 197  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 198  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 199  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 200  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 201  
activities. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 204  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 205  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 206  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 207  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 208

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 209  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 210  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 211  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 212  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 213  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 214  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 215  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 216  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 219



thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 220  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 221  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 222  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 223  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 224

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 225  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 226  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 227  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 228  
families. 229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 231  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 232  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 233  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 234  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 235  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 236  
destination. 237

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 238  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 239  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 240  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 241  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 242

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 243  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 244  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 245  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 246  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 247  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 248  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 249

cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 250  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 251  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 252  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 255  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 257  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 258  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 259  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 260  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 261  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 262  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 263  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 264  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 265  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 266  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 267  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 268  
under this section. 269

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 270  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 271  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 272  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 273  
programs. 274

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 275  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 276  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 277  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 278

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the

Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 309  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park. 311  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 315  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization. 319  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs. 323  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders. 329  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 334  
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to take greater responsibility for improving the local 338  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 339  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 341  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 342  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 343  
the contributions for educational purposes. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 346  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 347  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 348

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 349  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 350  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 351  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 352  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 353  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 354  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 355  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 356

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 357  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 358  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 359  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 360  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 361  
(G) of that section. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 364  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 365  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 366

preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 367  
Ohio and for educational programs. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 370  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 371  
supporting cancer research. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 374  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 375

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 376  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 377  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 380  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 381  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 382  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 385  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 386  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 387  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 390  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 391  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 392  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 393  
scouts. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395

receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 396  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 397  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 398  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 401  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 402  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 405  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 406  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 409  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 410  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 411  
charitable purposes. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 414  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 417  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 418  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 419  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 422  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 423  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 424

used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 425  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 426  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 428  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 429  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 430  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 431  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 432  
in the line of duty. 433

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 434  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 435  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 436  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 437  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 439  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 440  
association of chiefs of police. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 443  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 444  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 445  
families. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 448  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 449  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 452  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 453



association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 454  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 455  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 456  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 457  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 458  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 459  
participating in that program. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 462  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 463  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 465  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 466
