A BILL

То	amend sections 3301.01, 3301.02, 3301.03, and]
	3301.06 of the Revised Code to change the voting	2
	membership of the State Board of Education to	3
	consist of only elected members.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3301.01, 3301.02, 3301.03, and	5
3301.06 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3301.01. (A) There is hereby created the state board	7
of education consisting of nineteen members with eleven elected	8
members, one each to be elected in accordance with section	9
3301.03 of the Revised Code from each of the districts	10
established in accordance with division (B) of this section, and	11
with eight members to be appointed by the governor with the	12
advice and consent of the senate.	13
In addition to the <u>nineteen eleven</u> elected or appointed	14
members, the chairperson of the committee of the senate that	1.5

primarily deals with education and the chairperson of the

committee of the house of representatives that primarily deals

with education shall be nonvoting ex officio members of the

board.

- (B) (1) The territory of each state board of education 20 district for each elected voting member of the board shall 21 consist of the territory of three contiguous senate districts as 22 established in the most recent apportionment for members of the 23 general assembly, but the territory of no senate district shall 24 25 be part of the territory of more than one state board of 26 education district. Each state board of education district shall be as compact as practicable. The districts shall include, when 27 practicable, some districts that primarily consist of territory 28 in rural areas and some districts that primarily consist of 29 territory in urban areas. 30
- (2) If, after the apportionment for members of the general 31 assembly is made in any year, the general assembly does not 32 during that year enact legislation establishing state board-of-33 education districts in accordance with division (B)(1) of this 34 section, the governor shall designate the boundaries of the 35 districts in accordance with division (B)(1) of this section no 36 later than the thirty-first day of January of the year next 37 succeeding such apportionment. Upon making such designation, the 38 governor shall give written notice of the boundaries of the 39 districts to each member of the state board-of education, 40 including the nonvoting ex officio members; the superintendent 41 of public instruction; the president of the senate; the speaker 42 of the house of representatives; and the board of elections of 43 each county in each new district. On the first day of February 44 in any year in which the governor designates the boundaries of 45 state board of education districts under this section, the state 46

Sec. 3301.02. (A) Elected voting Voting members of the	49
state board of education shall be elected as required by	50
expiration of respective terms, each for a term of four years or	51
until a successor is elected and qualified. One elected member	52
shall be elected from each district respectively in which the	53
term of office of a board member expires on the first day of	54
January following the election. The term of office of each	55
member so elected shall begin on the first day of January	56
immediately following this election.	57
(B) At any time the boundaries of state board of education	58
districts are changed under division (B) of section 3301.01 of	59
the Revised Code, a member of the state board whose term will	60
not expire within two years of the time the change in boundaries	61
is made shall represent, for the remainder of the term for which	62
the member was elected, the state board district containing the	63
largest portion of the population of the district from which the	64
member was elected. If more than one member whose term will not	65
so expire would represent the same district under the provisions	66
of this section, either the general assembly, if the general	67
assembly enacted legislation establishing those districts under	68
division (B)(2) of section 3301.01 of the Revised Code, or the	69
governor, if the governor designated the boundaries boundaries	70
of the districts under that division, shall designate which	71
member shall represent each district for the balance of the	72
members' terms.	73
(C) - Appointed voting members of the board shall serve-	74
four-year terms beginning the first day of January and ending on	75
the thirty-first day of December. Except as provided in division	76

(D) of this section, members may be reappointed.	77
(D) No person, elected or appointed, shall hold the office	78
of member of the state board of education for a period of longer	79
than two successive terms of four years. Terms shall be	80
considered successive unless separated by a period of four or	81
more years. Only terms beginning on or after January 1, 1996,	82
shall be considered in determining an individual's eligibility	83
to hold office.	84
Sec. 3301.03. (A) Each elected voting member of the state	85
board of education shall be a qualified elector residing in the	86
territory composing the district from which the member is	87
elected, and shall be nominated and elected to office as	88
provided by Title XXXV of the Revised Code.—Each appointed—	89
voting member of the board shall be a qualified elector residing-	90
in the state. At least four of the appointed voting members-	91
shall represent rural school districts in the state, as-	92
evidenced by the member's current place of residence and at	93
least one of the following:	94
(A) The member's children attend, or at one time attended,	95
school in a rural district;	96
(B) The member's past or present occupation is associated	97
with rural areas of the state;	98
(C) The member possesses other credentials or experience-	99
demonstrating knowledge and familiarity with rural school	100
districts.	101
(B) No-elected or appointed voting member of the board	102
shall, during the member's term of office, hold any other office	103
of trust or profit or be an employee or officer of any public or	104
private elementary or secondary school. Before entering on the	105

duties of office, each elected and appointed voting member shall	106
subscribe to the official oath of office.	107
Each voting member of the state board of education shall	108
be paid a salary fixed pursuant to division (J) of section	109
124.15 of the Revised Code, together with the member's actual	110
and necessary expenses incurred while engaged in the performance	111
of the member's official duties or in the conduct of authorized	112
board business, and while en route to and from the member's home	113
for such purposes.	114
(D) (C) As used in this section only, "office of trust or	115
<pre>profit" means:</pre>	116
(1) A federal or state elective office or an elected	117
office of a political subdivision of the state;	118
(2) A position on a board or commission of the state that	119
is appointed by the governor;	120
(3) An office set forth in section 121.03, 121.04, or	121
121.05 of the Revised Code;	122
(4) An office of the government of the United States that	123
is appointed by the president of the United States.	124
Sec. 3301.06. A vacancy in among the voting members of the	125
state board of education may be caused by death, nonresidence,	126
resignation, removal from office, failure of a person elected to	127
qualify within ten days after the organization of the board or	128
of the person's election, removal from the district of election	129
or from residence in the state, or absence from any two	130
consecutive regular meetings of the board if such absence is	131
caused by reasons declared insufficient by a vote of twelve	132
seven voting members of the board. When a vacancy occurs in the	133
office of an elected a voting member, the governor shall, within	134

a period of thirty days and with the advice and consent of the	135
senate, appoint a qualified person residing in the district in	136
which the vacancy occurred to fill the vacancy until the next	137
general election at which members of the state board of	138
education are elected, at which time a qualified elector	139
residing in the district in which the vacancy occurred shall be	140
elected for the unexpired term. Such member shall assume office	141
