# A BILL

То	enact section 3345.024 of the Revised Code to	1
	enact "The Testing Your Faith Act" to require	2
	each state institution of higher education to	3
	adopt a policy providing students with religious	4
	accommodations.	5

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3345.024 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3345.024. Each state institution of higher education,	8
as defined in section 3345.011 of the Revised Code, shall adopt	9
a policy that reasonably accommodates the sincerely held	10
religious beliefs and practices of individual students with	11
regard to all examinations or other academic requirements and	12
absences for reasons of faith or religious or spiritual belief	13
system. The policy shall satisfy all of the following	14

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#### conditions:

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(A) The policy shall permit a student to be absent for up	16	
to three days each academic semester to take holidays for	17	
reasons of faith or religious or spiritual belief system or	18	
participate in organized activities conducted under the auspices	19	
of a religious denomination, church, or other religious or	20	
spiritual organization. The institution shall not impose an	21	
academic penalty as a result of a student being absent as	22	
permitted in the policy.	23	
(B)(1) The policy shall require that students be provided	24	
with alternative accommodations with regard to examinations and	25	
other academic requirements missed due to an absence described	26	
in division (A) of this section, if both of the following apply:	27	
(a) The student's sincerely held religious belief or	28	
practice severely affects the student's ability to take an	29	
examination or meet an academic requirement.		
(b) Not later than fourteen days after the first day of	31	
instruction in a particular course, the student provides the	32	
instructor with written notice of the specific dates for which	33	
the student requests alternative accommodations.	34	
(2) An instructor shall accept without question the	35	
sincerity of a student's religious or spiritual belief system.	36	
An instructor shall keep requests for alternative accommodations	37	
confidential. An instructor shall schedule a time and date for	38	
an alternative examination, which may be before or after the	39	
time and date the examination or other academic requirement was		
originally scheduled, but shall do so without prejudicial		
effect.		
(C) The policy shall require the institution to post both	43	

of the following in a prominent location on the institution's 44 45 web site: (1) A copy of the policy adopted under this section, which 46 shall include the contact information of an individual who can 47 provide further information about the policy; 48 (2) A nonexhaustive list of major religious holidays or 49 festivals for the next two academic years 50 . The chancellor of higher education shall provide each 51 state institution with a nonexhaustive list of major religious 52 holidays or festivals for the next two academic years at the 53 beginning of each academic year. Each state institution may 54 adopt the chancellor's list in its entirety or choose which 55 holidays to include on its list. 56 Each time a state institution's policy is posted, printed, 57 or published, including as described in divisions (C) and (D) of 58 this section, the state institution shall include a statement 59 that the list is nonexhaustive, and the list may not be used to 60 deny accommodation to a student for a holiday or festival of the 61 student's faith or religious or spiritual belief system that 62 63 does not appear on the list. Nothing in this section, and no inclusion or exclusion of 64 a religious holiday or festival on the list posted by a state 65 institution, shall preclude a student from full and reasonable 66 accommodations for any sincerely held religious beliefs and 67 practices with regard to all examinations or other academic 68 requirements and absences for reasons of faith or religious or 69 spiritual belief system provided under this section. 70 (D) The policy shall require instructors to include in 71 each course syllabus a statement regarding the institutions's 72

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policy adopted under this section. The statement shall include	73
both of the following:	
(1) A description of the general procedure for requesting	75
accommodations;	
(2) Contact information for an individual whom a student	77
may contact for more information about the policy adopted under	78
this section.	
(E) The policy shall include a procedure under which a	80
student may notify the institution of any grievance with regard	81
to the implementation of the policy.	
Section 2. This act shall be known as "The Testing Your	83
Faith Act."	

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
