BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 182.01 of the Revised Code be	5
enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 182.01. (A) For purposes of this section:	7
"Political subdivision" means any county, township,	8
municipal corporation, public school, city or general health	9
district, alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services	10
board, or other body corporate and politic that is responsible	11
for government activities in a geographic area smaller than the	12
state.	13
"Public school" means a school district created under	14
Chapter 3311., community school created under Chapter 3314.,	15
STEM school created under Chapter 3326., or college-preparatory	16
boarding school created under Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code.	17

(B) There is hereby created the loving state index	18
commission. The commission shall do all of the following:	19
(1) Establish a system to evaluate and rank municipal	20
corporations in this state regarding critical supports that are	21
vital to student academic success in order to identify gaps in	22
opportunity for low-income individuals and minority individuals.	
The system shall be known as the loving state index.	24
(2) Establish criteria to evaluate the following factors	25
for purposes of division (B)(1) of this section:	26
(a) Early childhood education participation;	27
(b) Preschool suspension alternatives;	28
(c) Gifted classes offered for kindergarten through grade	29
eight;	30
(d) Suspension and expulsion alternatives for kindergarten	31
through grade twelve;	32
(e) Advanced high school curriculum;	33
(f) Advanced placement curricula;	34
(g) Anti-bullying;	35
(h) School-to-prison alternatives;	36
(i) Well-resourced schools;	37
(j) Experienced teachers;	38
(k) In-school support staff;	39
(1) Economically integrated schools;	40
(m) Access to health insurance;	41
(n) Prenatal health services;	42

(o) Access to mental health services;	43	
(p) Access to healthy food;	44	
(q) Clean air environments;	45	
(r) Access to parks;	46

(3) Use data from the primary or largest school district	53	
in each municipal corporation in which multiple school districts		
exist.	55	
(4) Not later than July 1, 2022, and annually thereafter,	56	
publish and submit to the members of the general assembly a	57	
report containing the commission's evaluation and ranking of	58	
municipal corporations. The report shall be available online via	59	
the web sites of the departments of education, health, commerce,	60	
natural resources, environmental protection services, and	61	
transportation, JobsOhio, and the governor's office of faith-	62	
based and community initiatives. The report shall contain	63	
information regarding the scoring strategy, data, and analysis	64	
the commission used.	65	
(C) The commission consists of the following eight	66	
members:	67	
(1) The superintendent of public instruction or the	68	

<pre>superintendent's designee;</pre>		
(2) The director of health or the director's designee;	70	
(3) The director of commerce or the director's designee;	71	
(4) The director of natural resources or the director's	72	
<pre>designee;</pre>		
(5) The director of environmental protection or the	74	
<pre>director's designee;</pre>	75	
(6) The director of transportation or the director's	76	
<pre>designee;</pre>		
(7) The chief investment officer of JobsOhio or the	78	
officer's designee;		
(8) The executive director of the governor's office of	80	
faith-based and community initiatives or the director's		
designee.		
(D) The commission shall select from its membership a	83	
chairperson. The members of the commission shall serve without	84	
compensation, but shall be reimbursed for the actual and	85	
necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official	86	
<u>duties.</u>	87	
(E) Political subdivisions shall provide data to the	88	
commission upon request unless the data is exempt from		
disclosure as a public record under section 149.43 of the		
Revised Code.
