BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5119.61 of the Revised Code be	6
amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 5119.61. (A) The department of mental health and	8
addiction services shall collect and compile statistics and	9
other information on the care and treatment of mentally disabled	10
persons, with mental disabilities and the care, treatment, and	11
rehabilitation of alcoholicspersons with alcohol use disorder,	12
drug dependent persons with substance use disorder, persons in	13
danger of drug dependenceat risk of substance use disorder, and	14
persons with or in danger of developing a gambling addiction in	15
this state. The information shall include, without limitation,	16

(C) Communications by a person seeking aid in good faith	90
for alcoholism <u>alcohol use disorder</u> or drug dependence <u>substance</u>	91
use disorder are confidential, and this section does not require	92

reveals or comprises the identity of any person seeking aid.	94
(D) Based on the information collected and compiled under	95
division (A) of this section, the department shall-develop:	96
(1) Develop a project to assess the outcomes of persons	97
served by community addiction services providers and community	98
mental health services providers that receive funds distributed	99

(2) Submit a quarterly report to the governor, the general	101
assembly, and each board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental	102
health services summarizing and analyzing the information_	103

assembly shall be submitted in accordance with section 101.68 of	105
the Revised Code. The department shall post a copy of each	106
quarterly report on its web site.	107
(3) Submit an annual report to the governor, the general	108
assembly, and each board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental	109
health services summarizing and analyzing the information	110
collected in the previous year. All copies shall be submitted in	111
hard copy format, and the copy to the general assembly shall be	112
submitted in accordance with section 101.68 of the Revised Code,	113
with the exception of the requirement in division (D) of that	114
section. The department shall post a copy of each annual report	115
on its web site.
