A BILL

To amend section 5119.61 of the Revised Code to
require the Ohio Department of Mental Health and
Addiction Services to collect certain data
regarding alcohol and drug addiction services
and recovery supports.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5119.61 of the Revised Code be
amended to read as follows:

Sec. 5119.61. (A) The department of mental health and
addiction services shall collect and compile statistics and
other information on the care and treatment of ~~mentally disabled~~
persons, with mental disabilities and the care, treatment, and
rehabilitation of ~~alcoholics~~ persons with alcohol use disorder,
~~drug dependent persons~~ with substance use disorder, persons ~~in-~~
~~danger of drug dependence~~ at risk of substance use disorder, and
persons with or in danger of developing a gambling addiction in
this state. The information shall include, without limitation,
information on ~~the:~~

(1) The number of such persons, ~~the;~~

<u>(2) The type of drug involved, if any, the;</u>	19
<u>(3) The type of care, treatment, or rehabilitation prescribed or undertaken, and the including:</u>	20
<u>(a) The name of the medication-assisted treatment prescribed, if any;</u>	21
<u>(b) Whether the care, treatment, or rehabilitation of persons with alcohol use disorder, persons with substance use disorder, and persons at risk of substance use disorder is inpatient or outpatient.</u>	22
<u>(4) The success or failure of the care, treatment, or rehabilitation. The department shall collect information, including:</u>	23
<u>(a) The number and percentage of persons with alcohol use disorder, persons with substance use disorder, and persons at risk of substance use disorder who completed a care, treatment, or rehabilitation program;</u>	24
<u>(b) The number and percentage of persons with alcohol use disorder, persons with substance use disorder, and persons at risk of substance use disorder who relapsed while in the process of completing a care, treatment, or rehabilitation program.</u>	25
<u>(5) The following data collected during the admission process at alcohol and drug addiction services and recovery supports providers:</u>	26
<u>(a) The number of new admissions and the number of transfers from other providers;</u>	27
<u>(b) The number of persons who have previously received alcohol and drug addiction services and recovery supports, and the number of times such persons have previously received</u>	28

<u>alcohol and drug addiction services and recovery supports;</u>	47
<u>(c) Characteristics of each person being admitted</u>	48
<u>including age, sex, race, ethnicity, education, employment</u>	49
<u>status, source of income or financial support, marital status,</u>	50
<u>living arrangements, veteran status, pregnancy status,</u>	51
<u>additional psychiatric diagnoses, arrests in the thirty days</u>	52
<u>prior to admission, frequency of attendance at self-help</u>	53
<u>programs in the thirty days prior to admission, source of</u>	54
<u>referral, usual route of drug administration, frequency of</u>	55
<u>alcohol or drug use, and age of first alcohol or drug use.</u>	56
<u>(6) The following data collected during the discharge</u>	57
<u>process from alcohol and drug addiction services and recovery</u>	58
<u>supports providers:</u>	59
<u>(a) Characteristics of each person being discharged</u>	60
<u>including frequency of alcohol or drug use since starting</u>	61
<u>treatment, living arrangements, employment status, pregnancy</u>	62
<u>status, arrests in the thirty days prior to discharge, and</u>	63
<u>frequency of attendance at self-help programs in the thirty days</u>	64
<u>prior to discharge;</u>	65
<u>(b) The number of days each person being discharged</u>	66
<u>received care, treatment, and rehabilitation;</u>	67
<u>(c) The reason for discharge, transfer, or discontinuance</u>	68
<u>of treatment.</u>	69
<u>(7) The capacity of each alcohol and drug addiction</u>	70
<u>services and recovery supports provider and the proportion of</u>	71
<u>that capacity in use;</u>	72
<u>(8) The cost to the state associated with each community</u>	73
<u>addiction services provider;</u>	74

(9) The number of licensed and certified professionals 75
employed at each alcohol and drug addiction services and 76
recovery supports provider; 77

(10) Information about addiction services, mental health 78
services, and recovery supports delivered and persons served as 79
required for reporting and evaluation relating to state and 80
federal funds expended for such purposes. 81

(B) No ~~community addiction services provider or community~~ 82
~~mental health services provider or agency, association,~~ 83
corporation or other legal entity, individual, or program 84
providing addiction services and recovery supports shall fail to 85
supply statistics and other information within its knowledge and 86
with respect to its ~~addiction services,~~ mental health services, 87
addiction services, and recovery supports upon request of the 88
department. 89

(C) Communications by a person seeking aid in good faith 90
for ~~alcoholism-alcohol use disorder or drug dependence-substance~~ 91
use disorder are confidential, and this section does not require 92
the collection or permit the disclosure of information which 93
reveals or comprises the identity of any person seeking aid. 94

(D) Based on the information collected and compiled under 95
division (A) of this section, the department shall ~~develop;~~ 96

(1) Develop a project to assess the outcomes of persons 97
served by community addiction services providers and community 98
mental health services providers that receive funds distributed 99
by the department; 100

(2) Submit a quarterly report to the governor, the general 101
assembly, and each board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental 102
health services summarizing and analyzing the information 103

collected in the previous quarter. The copy to the general 104
assembly shall be submitted in accordance with section 101.68 of 105
the Revised Code. The department shall post a copy of each 106
quarterly report on its web site. 107

(3) Submit an annual report to the governor, the general 108
assembly, and each board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental 109
health services summarizing and analyzing the information 110
collected in the previous year. All copies shall be submitted in 111
hard copy format, and the copy to the general assembly shall be 112
submitted in accordance with section 101.68 of the Revised Code, 113
with the exception of the requirement in division (D) of that 114
section. The department shall post a copy of each annual report 115
on its web site. 116

Section 2. That existing section 5119.61 of the Revised 117
Code is hereby repealed. 118
