## A BILL

To allow committee meetings and general sessions of	1
the House of Representatives to be conducted	2
virtually and to declare an emergency.	3

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) During the period of emergency declared by	4
Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, the	5
chairperson of a standing committee, subcommittee, or select	6
committee of the House of Representatives, or a joint committee	7
of the General Assembly may conduct committee meetings by means	8
of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar	9
electronic technology and all of the following shall apply:	10
(1) Any resolution, rule, or formal action of any kind	11
shall have the same effect as if it had occurred during an open	12
meeting of the committee.	13
(2) Members of the House of Representatives who attend	14
meetings by means of teleconference, video conference, or any	15

other similar electronic technology, shall be considered present16as if in person at the meeting, shall be permitted to vote, and17shall be counted for purposes of determining whether a quorum is18present at the meeting.19

(3) The chairperson shall provide notification of meetings held during a declared emergency to the public and to the media that have requested notification of a meeting at least twentyfour hours in advance of the meeting by reasonable methods by which any person may determine the time, electronic location, and the manner by which the meeting will be conducted, except in the event of an emergency requiring immediate official action. In the event of an emergency, the chairperson shall immediately notify the news media that have requested notification of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

(4) The chairperson shall provide the public access to a 30 meeting held virtually during a declared emergency, commensurate 31 with the method in which the meeting is being conducted, 32 including, but not limited to, livestreaming by means of the 33 internet, local radio, television, cable, or public access 34 channels, call in information for a teleconference, or by means 35 of any other similar electronic technology. The chairperson 36 shall ensure that the public can hear, and if the technological 37 means permit observation, observe the discussions and 38 deliberations of all the members of the committee, whether the 39 member is participating in person or electronically. 40

(B) When a committee conducts a meeting by means of
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teleconference, video conference, or any other similar
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electronic technology, the chairperson shall establish a means,
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through the use of electronic equipment that is widely available
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to the general public, to converse with witnesses, and to

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receive documentary testimony and physical evidence.

Section 2. During the period of emergency declared by Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, the Speaker of the House of Representatives may conduct sessions of the House of Representatives by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology and all of the following shall apply:

Any resolution, rule, or formal action of any kind shall53have the same effect as if it had occurred during an open54meeting of the House of Representatives.55

Members of the House of Representatives who attend sessions by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology, shall be considered present as if in person during session, shall be permitted to vote, and shall be counted for purposes of determining whether a quorum is present.

The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall provide 62 notification of sessions held during a declared emergency to the 63 public and to the media that have requested notification of a 64 session at least twenty-four hours in advance of the meeting by 65 reasonable methods by which any person may determine the time, 66 electronic location, and the manner by which the session will be 67 conducted, except in the event of an emergency requiring 68 immediate official action. In the event of an emergency, the 69 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall immediately notify 70 the news media that have requested notification of the time, 71 place, and purpose of the session. 72

The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall provide73the public access to a session held virtually during a declared74

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emergency commensurate with the method in which the meeting is 75 being conducted, including, but not limited to, examples such as 76 livestreaming by means of the internet, local radio, television, 77 cable, or public access channels, call in information for a 78 teleconference, or by means of any other similar electronic 79 technology. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall 80 ensure that the public can hear, and if the technological means 81 permit observation, observe the discussions and deliberations of 82 all of the members of the House of Representatives, whether the 83 member is participating in person or electronically. 84

Section 3. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency 85 measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 86 peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is that 87 physical distancing is an essential measure to slow the spread 88 of COVID-19. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect. 89

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
