То	amend sections 109.731 and 2923.25 of the	1
	Revised Code to require federally licensed	2
	firearms dealers to give each firearm purchaser	3
	a specified brochure that provides information	4
	on using deadly force and outlines the laws	5
	about dispute resolution.	6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 109.731 and 2923.25 of the	7
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 109.731. (A)(1) The attorney general shall prescribe,	9
and shall make available to sheriffs an application form that is	10
to be used under section 2923.125 of the Revised Code by a	11
person who applies for a concealed handgun license and an	12
application form that is to be used under section 2923.125 of	13
the Revised Code by a person who applies for the renewal of a	14
license of that nature. The attorney general shall design the	15
form to enable applicants to provide the information that is	16
required by law to be collected, and shall update the form as	17
necessary. Burdens or restrictions to obtaining a concealed	18

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handgun license that are not expressly prescribed in law shall	19
not be incorporated into the form. The attorney general shall	20
post a printable version of the form on the web site of the	21
attorney general and shall provide the address of the web site	22
to any person who requests the form.	23
(2) The Ohio peace officer training commission shall	24
prescribe, and shall make available to sheriffs, all of the	25
following:	26
(a) A form for the concealed handgun license that is to be	27
issued by sheriffs to persons who qualify for a concealed	28
handgun license under section 2923.125 of the Revised Code and	29
that conforms to the following requirements:	30
(i) It has space for the licensee's full name, residence	31
address, and date of birth and for a color photograph of the	32
licensee.	33
(ii) It has space for the date of issuance of the license,	34
its expiration date, its county of issuance, the name of the	35
sheriff who issues the license, and the unique combination of	36
letters and numbers that identify the county of issuance and the	37
license given to the licensee by the sheriff in accordance with	38
division (A)(2)(c) of this section.	39
(iii) It has space for the signature of the licensee and	4 C
the signature or a facsimile signature of the sheriff who issues	41
the license.	42
(iv) It does not require the licensee to include serial	43
numbers of handguns, other identification related to handguns,	44
or similar data that is not pertinent or relevant to obtaining	45
the license and that could be used as a de facto means of	46
registration of handguns owned by the licensee.	47

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(b) A series of three-letter county codes that identify	48
each county in this state;	49
(c) A procedure by which a sheriff shall give each	50
concealed handgun license, replacement concealed handgun	51
license, or renewal concealed handgun license and each concealed	52
handgun license on a temporary emergency basis or replacement	53
license on a temporary emergency basis the sheriff issues under	54
section 2923.125 or 2923.1213 of the Revised Code a unique	55
combination of letters and numbers that identifies the county in	56
which the license was issued and that uses the county code and a	57
unique number for each license the sheriff of that county	58
issues;	59
(d) A form for a concealed handgun license on a temporary	60
emergency basis that is to be issued by sheriffs to persons who	61
qualify for such a license under section 2923.1213 of the	62
Revised Code, which form shall conform to all the requirements	63
set forth in divisions (A)(2)(a)(i) to (iv) of this section and	64
shall additionally conspicuously specify that the license is	65
issued on a temporary emergency basis and the date of its	66
issuance.	67
(B)(1) The Ohio peace officer training commission, in	68
consultation with the attorney general, shall prepare $\frac{a-both\ of}{a-both\ of}$	69
<pre>the following:</pre>	70
(a) A pamphlet that does all of the following, in everyday	71
language:	72
(a) (i) Explains the firearms laws of this state;	73
(b) (ii) Instructs the reader in dispute resolution and	74
explains the laws of this state related to that matter;	75
(c) (iii) Provides information to the reader regarding all	76

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aspects of the use of deadly force with a firearm, including,	77
but not limited to, the steps that should be taken before	78
contemplating the use of, or using, deadly force with a firearm,	
possible alternatives to using deadly force with a firearm, and	
the law governing the use of deadly force with a firearm.	81
(b) A foldable brochure that summarizes the information in	82
divisions (B) (1) (a) (ii) and (iii) of this section.	83
(2) The attorney general shall consult with and assist the	84
commission in the preparation of the pamphlet and brochure	85
described in division (B)(1) of this section and, as necessary,	86
shall recommend to the commission changes in the pamphlet and	87
brochure to reflect changes in the law that are relevant to it.	88
The attorney general shall publish the pamphlet and brochure on	89
the web site of the attorney general and shall provide the	90
address of the web site to any person who requests the pamphlet	91
or brochure.	
(3) The attorney general shall create and maintain a	93
section on the attorney general's web site that provides	94
information on firearms laws of this state specifically	95
applicable to members of the armed forces of the United States	96
and a link to the pamphlet described in division (B)(1) of this	97

Code. Not later than the first day of March in each year, the	108
commission shall submit a statistical report to the governor,	109
the president of the senate, and the speaker of the house of	110
representatives indicating the number of concealed handgun	111
licenses that were issued, renewed, suspended, revoked, and	112
denied under section 2923.125 of the Revised Code in the	113
previous calendar year, the number of applications for those	114
licenses for which processing was suspended in accordance with	115
division (D)(3) of that section in the previous calendar year,	116
and the number of concealed handgun licenses on a temporary	117
emergency basis that were issued, suspended, revoked, or denied	118
under section 2923.1213 of the Revised Code in the previous	119
calendar year. Nothing in the statistics or the statistical	120
report shall identify, or enable the identification of, any	121
individual who was issued or denied a license, for whom a	122
license was renewed, whose license was suspended or revoked, or	123
for whom application processing was suspended. The statistics	124
and the statistical report are public records for the purpose of	125
section 149.43 of the Revised Code.	126
(D) As used in this section, "concealed handgun license"	127
and "handgun" have the same meanings as in section 2923.11 of	128
the Revised Code.	129
Sec. 2923.25. (A) Each federally licensed firearms dealer	130
who sells any firearm, at shall do all of the following:	131
(1) At the time of the sale of the firearm, shall offer	132
for sale to the purchaser of the firearm a trigger lock, gun	133
lock, or gun locking device that is appropriate for that	134
firearm. Each federally licensed firearms dealer shall post;	135

(2) At the time of the sale of the firearm, provide to the

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purchaser of the firearm the brochure prepared pursuant to	137	
section 109.731 of the Revised Code;	138	
(3) Post in a conspicuous location in the dealer's place	139	
of business the poster furnished to the dealer pursuant to	140	
section 5502.63 of the Revised Code and—shall make available to	141	
all purchasers of firearms from the dealer the brochure	142	
furnished to the dealer pursuant to that section.	143	
(B) As used in this section, "federally licensed firearms	144	
dealer" has the same meaning as in section 5502.63 of the	145	
Revised Code.	146
