# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, Emerging research in neuroscience and psychology	3
reported by the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN)	4
shows that trauma has a foundational impact on various aspects	5
of human development across the lifespan; and	6
WHEREAS, According to the NCTSN, complex trauma	7
differentially impacts vulnerable, marginalized,	8
underrepresented, and at-risk people experiencing poverty,	9
disability, or systemic oppression due to religion, gender	10
identity, or sexual orientation; and	11
WHEREAS, The 2017-2018 National Survey of Children's Health	12
(NSCH) found that more than 500,000 Ohio children reported one	13
or more adverse childhood experiences (such as divorce, death of	14
a parent, having a parent who served time in jail, experiencing	15
violence in the home or community, being a victim of violence,	16
or living with a person with mental illness or a problem with	17
drugs or alcohol) and more than 400,000 Ohio children reported	18
two or more adverse childhood experiences; and	19
WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics describes	20

adverse childhood experiences as stressful or traumatic events	21
that occur during childhood and are strongly related to a wide	22
range of health problems; and	23
WHEREAS, Culture can provide a source of strength, unique	24
coping strategies, and specific resources to respond to trauma;	25
and	26
WHEREAS, Culture influences how an individual interprets	25
and assigns meaning to trauma, impacts how an individual conveys	28
stress through behavior, emotions, and thinking, and affects the	29
determination of health concerns and appropriate interventions	30
and treatments; and	31
WHEREAS, The NCTSN acknowledges that poverty is a	32
contributing factor to childhood trauma; and	33
WHEREAS, The NCTSN discusses how children living in poverty	34
experience chronic stress and feelings of instability and are	35
more likely to live in neighborhoods with high rates of exposure	36
to other traumas such as neighborhood violence and house fires;	37

WHEREAS, The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services	39
Administration (SAMHSA) recognizes that a trauma-informed	4 (
approach is not a prescribed set of practices or procedures, but	41
instead reflects adherence to the following six key principles	42
that can be generalized across multiple settings: (1) safety;	43
(2) trustworthiness and transparency; (3) peer support; (4)	44

WHEREAS, Based on the sources described above, we	54
acknowledge that children experience long-term consequences from	55
trauma they receive through oppressive systems, and part of the	56
goal of this resolution is to recognize how those systems	57
perpetuate trauma among children living in poverty; now	58
therefore be it	59
RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 134th General	60
Assembly of the State of Ohio, call upon the Governor to take	61
action to address childhood trauma and respectfully urge him to	62
declare a State of Emergency on Childhood Trauma to increase	63
public knowledge in identifying and treating the conditions	64
caused by post-traumatic stress disorders related to child	65
development, with an emphasis on the six key principles of a	66
trauma-informed approach; and be it further	67
RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives	68
transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the	69
Governor and the news media of Ohio.	70
