## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5122.04 and 5164.15 of the	7
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 5122.04. (A) Upon the request of a minor fourteen	9
years of age or older, a mental health professional may provide	10
outpatient mental health services, excluding the use of	11
medication, without the consent or knowledge of the minor's	12
parent or guardian. Except as otherwise provided in this section-	13
division, the minor's parent or guardian shall not be informed	14
of the services without the minor's consent unless the mental	15
health professional treating the minor determines that there is	16
a compelling need for disclosure based on a substantial	17
probability of harm to the minor or to other persons, and if the	18
minor is notified of the mental health professional's intent to	19

inform the minor's parent, or guardian. 20 (B) Services provided to a minor pursuant to this section 21 division shall be limited to not more than six sessions or 22 thirty days of services, whichever occurs sooner. After the 23 sixth session or thirty days of services<sub>1</sub> the mental health 24 professional shall terminate the services or, with the consent 25 of the minor, notify the parent, or guardian, to obtain consent 26 to provide further outpatient services. 27 (C) The minor's parent or guardian shall not be liable for 28 29 the costs of services which are received by a minor under this division-(A). 30 (D) (B) (1) A mental health professional may provide a 31 crisis assessment to a minor without the consent or knowledge of 32 the minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian if both of the 33 following are the case: 34 (a) The mental health professional believes that the minor 35 may be suicidal or may pose a risk of physical harm to others or 36 the mental health professional has received credible information 37 from an adult supervising the minor that the minor may be 38 39 suicidal or may pose a risk of physical harm to others. (b) The minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian is 40 not available to provide consent. 41 (2) As soon as practicable after the crisis assessment, 42 the mental health professional shall make a good faith effort to 43 notify the minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian that the 44 45 assessment was provided. (C) The director of mental health and addiction services 46 shall adopt rules identifying the types of mental health 47 professionals who are permitted to provide outpatient mental 48

As part of the terms of the contract, 90 the departments shall identify the types of mental health 91 professionals who are permitted to render or supervise the 92 services. 93 Section 2. That existing sections 5122.04 and 5164.15 of 94 the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 95 Section 3. All items in this act are hereby appropriated 96 as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the 97 credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations 98 made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year 99 2022 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2023. 100 The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to 101 any other operating appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY 2023 102 biennium. 103 Section 4. 104

The foregoing appropriation item 200550, Foundation107Funding, shall be used to distribute grants of \$70,000 each108fiscal year to each educational service center to support the109employment of a licensed independent social worker who may110coordinate policy implementation and other services.111

Section 5. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 112 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 113 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 114 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 115 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 116 from operating appropriations contained in this act shall be 117 accounted for as though made in the main operating 118 appropriations act of the 134th General Assembly. The operating 119 appropriations made in this act are subject to all provisions of 120 the main operating appropriations act of the 134th General 121 Assembly that are generally applicable to such appropriations. 122

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
