### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 3319.40 of the Revised Code be	3
amended to read as follows:	4
Sec. 3319.46. (A) (1) The state board of education shall	5
adopt rules under Chapter 119. of the Revised Code that	6
establish both all of the following:	7
(a) A policy and standards for the implementation of	8
positive behavior intervention and supports framework;	9
(b) A policy and standards for the use of physical	10
restraint <del>or seclusion on students</del> ;	11
(c) A prohibition on the use of seclusion, as defined in	12
this section, on students.	13
(2) Within ninety days after the effective date of this	14
amendment (a) Not later than January 31, 2022, the state board	15
shall amend or update rule 3301-35-15 of the Administrative Code	16
to reflect the requirements of division (A)(1)(a) of this	17

section.	18
(b) Within ninety days after the effective date of this	19
amendment, the state board shall amend or update rule 3301-35-15	20
of the Administrative Code to reflect the prohibition on	21
seclusion prescribed by division (A)(1)(c) of this section.	22
(B)(1) Each school district board of education shall do	23
all of the following:	24
(a) Implement a positive behavior intervention and	25
supports framework on a system-wide basis that complies with	26
this section;	27
(b) Comply with any policy and standards adopted, amended,	28
or updated by the state board under this section;	29
(c) Submit any reports required by the department of	30
education or the general assembly with respect to the	31
implementation of a positive behavior intervention and supports	32
framework or suspension and expulsion of students in any of	33
grades pre-kindergarten through three.	34
(2) Each school district's positive behavior intervention	35
and supports framework may focus on the following:	36
(a) Comprehensive, school-wide data systems that enable	37
monitoring of academic progress, behavioral incidents,	38
attendance, and other critical indicators across classrooms;	39
(b) School-wide investment in evidence-based curricula and	40
effective instructional strategies, matched to students' needs,	41
and data to support teachers' academic instruction;	42
(c) An expectation by school administrators that classroom	43
practices be linked to and aligned with the school-wide system;	44

(d) Improving staff climate and culture regarding the role	45
of discipline in the classroom, established through the use of	46
positive and proactive communication and staff recognition.	47
(C) For purposes of this section, "positive:	48
(c) For purposes of this section, positive.	40
(1) "Positive behavior intervention and supports	49
framework" or "positive behavior intervention and supports"	50
means a multi-tiered, school-wide, behavioral framework	51
developed and implemented for the purpose of improving academic	52
and social outcomes and increasing learning for all students:	53
(2)(a) "Seclusion" means a procedure that does both of the	54
following:	55
(i) Isolates and confines a student in a separate area	56
until the student is no longer an immediate danger to the	57
<pre>student's self or others;</pre>	58
(ii) Occurs in a specifically constructed or designated	59
room or space that is physically isolated from common areas and	60
from which the student is physically prevented from leaving.	61
(b) "Seclusion" does not include any of the following:	62
(i) A situation in which a staff member who is trained in	63
the use of de-escalation techniques or restraint is physically	64
present in the same unlocked room as the student;	65
(ii) A behavioral intervention in which the student is	66
temporarily removed from the learning activity but in which the	67
student is not confined;	68
(iii) An in-school suspension or detention;	69
(iv) A break that is requested by the student and occurs	70
in a different location in the room or in a separate room.	71
