## A BILL

To amend section 3107.014 and to enact section	1
5103.57 of the Revised Code regarding	2
qualifications for adoption and foster care home	3
assessors and professional treatment staff.	4

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3107.014 be amended and section	5
5103.57 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3107.014. (A) Except as provided in division (B) of	7
this section, only an individual who meets all of the following	8
requirements may perform the duties of an assessor under	9
sections 3107.031, 3107.032, 3107.082, 3107.09, 3107.101,	10
3107.12, 5103.0324, and 5103.152 of the Revised Code:	11
(1) The individual must be in the employ of, appointed by,	12
or under contract with a court, public children services agency,	13
private child placing agency, or private noncustodial agency;	14
(2) The individual must be one of the following:	15
(a) A licensed professional clinical counselor, licensed	16
professional counselor, independent social worker, social	17

worker, independent marriage and family therapist, or marriage and family therapist licensed under Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code;

(b) A psychologist licensed under Chapter 4732. of theRevised Code;22

(c) A student working to earn a four-year, post-secondary 23 degree, or higher, in a social or behavior science, or both, who 24 conducts assessor's duties under the supervision of a licensed 25 professional clinical counselor, licensed professional 26 counselor, independent social worker, social worker, independent 27 marriage and family therapist, or marriage and family therapist 28 licensed under Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code or a 29 psychologist licensed under Chapter 4732. of the Revised Code. 30 Beginning July 1, 2009, a student is eligible under this 31 division only if the supervising licensed professional clinical 32 counselor, licensed professional counselor, independent social 33 worker, social worker, independent marriage and family 34 therapist, marriage and family therapist, or psychologist has 35 completed training in accordance with rules adopted under 36 section 3107.015 of the Revised Code. 37

(d) A civil service employee engaging in social work
without a license under Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code, as
permitted by division (A) (5) of section 4757.41 of the Revised
Code;

(e) A former employee of a public children services agency who, while so employed, conducted the duties of an assessor;

(f) An employee of a court or public children services44agency who is employed to conduct the duties of an assessor;45

(g) A person who holds at least a bachelor's degree in any 46

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of the following human services fields:	47

(3) The individual must complete training in accordance	62
with rules adopted under section 3107.015 of the Revised Code.	63
(B) An individual in the employ of, appointed by, or under	64
contract with a court prior to September 18, 1996, to conduct	65
adoption investigations of prospective adoptive parents may	66

perform the duties of an assessor under sections 3107.031,673107.032, 3107.082, 3107.09, 3107.101, 3107.12, 5103.0324, and685103.152 of the Revised Code if the individual complies with69division (A) (3) of this section regardless of whether the70individual meets the requirement of division (A) (2) of this71

section.

(C) A court, public children services agency, private child placing agency, or private noncustodial agency may employ, appoint, or contract with an assessor in the county in which a petition for adoption is filed and in any other county or location outside this state where information needed to complete or supplement the assessor's duties may be obtained. More than one assessor may be utilized for an adoption.

(D) Not later than January 1, 2008, the department of job 80 and family services shall develop and maintain an assessor 81 registry. The registry shall list all individuals who are 82 employed, appointed by, or under contract with a court, public 83 children services agency, private child placing agency, or 84 private noncustodial agency and meet the requirements of an 85 assessor as described in this section. A public children 86 services agency, private child placing agency, private 87 noncustodial agency, court, or any other person may contact the 88 department to determine if an individual is listed in the 89 assessor registry. An individual listed in the assessor registry 90 shall immediately inform the department when that individual is 91 no longer employed, appointed by, or under contract with a 92 court, public children services agency, private child placing 93 agency, or private noncustodial agency to perform the duties of 94 an assessor as described in this section. The director of job 95 and family services shall adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 96 119. of the Revised Code necessary for the implementation, 97 contents, and maintenance of the registry, and any sanctions 98 related to the provision of information, or the failure to 99 provide information, that is needed for the proper operation of 100 101 the assessor registry.

(2) "Specialized foster home" has the same meaning as in	113

(B) Professional treatment staff employed by a public	115
children services agency, private child placement agency, or	116
private noncustodial agency who are not subject to the licensing	117
requirements of Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code shall meet the	118
requirements of sections 5153.112 and 5153.122 of the Revised	119
Code.	120
