BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) In the event that Congress enacts Subtitle	4
D, Section 23002 of the Build Back Better Act, H.R. 5376 of the	5
117th Congress and appropriates funds for it, the Governor shall	6
submit a plan for universal, high-quality, free, inclusive, and	7
mixed delivery preschool services to the United States Secretary	8
of Health and Human Services. The Governor shall submit that	9
plan at such time, in the manner, and containing information as	10
the Secretary of Health and Human Services may require.	11
(B) Not later than thirty days after the plan submitted	12
pursuant to division (A) of this section is approved, the	13
Governor shall designate a lead agency to administer the	14
universal preschool program.	
(C) The designated lead agency shall begin administering	16
the universal preschool program not later than thirty days after	17
funds are made available for that purpose. In addition to	18
