BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section:	4
"Cooperative" means an "electric cooperative" as defined	5
in section 4928.01 of the Revised Code or a company that is	6
owned by, and operated exclusively for, its customers to supply	7
those customers with natural gas for lighting, power, or heating	8
purposes.	9
"Landlord" and "tenant" have the same meanings as in	10
section 5321.01 of the Revised Code.	11
"Manufactured home park lot" means a lot in a	12
"manufactured home park" as that term is defined in section	13
4781.01 of the Revised Code.	14
"Owner," "park operator," and "tenant" have the same	15

"Unregulated utility" means a telephone company, electric	36
light company, natural gas company, pipe-line company, water-	37
works company, heating or cooling company, or sewage disposal	38
system company as defined under section 4905.03 of the Revised	39
Code that is excepted from being included as a public utility	40
under section 4905.02 of the Revised Code or that is not subject	41
to regulation by the public utilities commission. "Unregulated	42

"Utility service" means the service provided by a	44

"State of emergency" means the period of the emergency 47 declared under Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 48 2020. 49 (B)(1) Except as provided in division (B)(3) of this 50 section, a cooperative, propane supply company, public utility, 51 submetering company, or unregulated utility shall not do either 52 of the following until six months after the state of emergency 53 terminates: 54 (a) Curtail, disrupt, or disconnect utility service; 55 (b) Take any action that would effectively lead to or 56 cause curtailment, disruption, or disconnection of utility 57 service. 58 (2) Neither of the following shall take the actions 59 described in division (B)(1)(a) or (b) of this section until six 60 months after the state of emergency terminates: 61 (a) A landlord with respect to the residential premises of 62 a tenant; 63 (b) A park operator with respect to a manufactured home 64 park lot occupied by a park tenant or owner. 65 66 (3) A cooperative, propane supply company, public utility, submetering company, or unregulated utility may take the actions 67 described in division (B)(1)(a) or (b) of this section to 68 prevent or resolve a presently or imminently hazardous situation 69 or on the request of the customer. 70 71 Section 2. This act is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and 72 safety. The reason for such necessity is to prevent utility 73 service curtailment, disruption, or disconnection due to unpaid 74

utility service bills, which bills are unpaid because of 75
unemployment or underemployment caused by the restrictions and 76
other precautions imposed as part of the state of emergency 77
regarding COVID-19. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate 78
effect. 79
