Not satisfied to rest on his laurels, he was appointed 11 to the Ohio State Senate in 1985, a post that he held until he retired 12 in 2000. During his tenure, he received the NFIB Legislator of the 13 Year, Watchdog of the Treasury, Veterans Man of the Year, and State 14 Government Man of the Year awards, and he demonstrated himself to be a 15 dedicated public servant whose noteworthy career serves as an 16 inspiration for others; and 17 WHEREAS, Throughout his life, Dick Schafrath manifested those 18 virtues we all seek to emulate, and he gave back to his community 19 through his involvement with various organizations, including 20 Fellowship of Christian Athletes, the Ohio Farm Bureau, the American 21

Legion, and Cleveland Browns Alumni. Clearly, he led an exemplary
