_____ moved to amend the amendment labeled AM1281-2 as follows:

In line 222 of the amendment, after the comma insert "or in the case of a record that is not a public record under division (A)(1)(tt) of this section that is retained, three years after the day on which the record was created,"

In line 1011 of the amendment, after "service" insert ", or a former designated public service worker who was an elected official, regardless of length of service"

In line 1027 of the amendment, after "standing" insert ". A qualifying former designated public service worker, who was an elected official, shall provide, with the form, a certificate of oath or a certificate of election, for the last term of office served, or a notarized affidavit attesting to the required service"

In line 1062 of the amendment, after "standing" insert ". A qualifying former designated public service worker, who was an elected official, shall provide, with the form, a certificate of oath or a certificate of election, for the last term of office served, or a"



notarized affidavit attesting to the required service" 17

Requires that a former designated public service worker, 22
who was an elected official, provide a certificate of oath or a 23
certificate of election, for the last term of office served, or 24
a notarized affidavit attesting to the required service, in 25
order to verify that the official is eligible for the address 26
protection provisions of the bill. 27

Waives the five-year service requirement for a former 28
designated public service worker who was an elected official. 29

Specifies that designated public worker work schedules, 30
which are exempt from disclosure under Public Records Law by the 31
bill, become a public record three years after the date they 32
were created, except for certain records as specified for 33
protection under current law. 34
