The appointing authority, prior to making an appointment, shall file with the Ohio police and fire pension fund or the local volunteer fire fighters' dependents fund board a copy of the report or findings of that licensed physician, physician assistant, clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse practitioner, or certified nurse-midwife. The professional fee for the physical examination shall be paid for by the board of township trustees.

Transportation Services to no longer issue new certifications in	843
order to serve as an assistant EMS or assistant fire instructor	844
(consistent with H.B. 509 of the 134th General Assembly), but	845
