26 at the end of fiscal year 2024, is hereby reappropriated for the
27 same purpose in fiscal year 2025.

30 used to support instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and
31 the use of an automated external defibrillator required for high

33 Code, in a manner determined by the Department of Education and
34 Workforce.

49 (A) The Department of Education and Workforce shall
50 distribute the funds set aside in appropriation item 200597,
51 Program and Project Support, for purposes of this section to the
52 following six United Way partner agencies to serve vulnerable
53 residents, families, and households in the counties within their
54 jurisdictions:

- 55 (1) United Way of Central Ohio;
- 56 (2) United Way of Fairfield County;
- 57 (3) United Way of Union County;
- 58 (4) United Way of Delaware County;
- 59 (5) United Way of Clark, Champaign and Madison Counties;

68 and other entities to achieve a measurable impact on student
69 achievement evidenced by improvements in academic performance,
70 attendance, reduced discipline rates, and other relevant
71 metrics;

72 (3) To implement programs that focus on enhanced case
73 management for improved family stability, with an emphasis on
74 programs that measurably impact academic and nonacademic
75 outcomes for children and youth;

76 (4) To support capacity-building to enhance sustainability
77 and to increase the ability of the United Way partner agencies
78 and their community partners to respond to ongoing needs of

103 **Sections 265.10, 265.355 and 265.____**

104 Increases GRF ALI 200597, Program and Project Support, by
105 \$7,073,000 in FY 2024 and \$6,323,000 in FY 2025.

106 Restores to the House-passed version of the bill the
107 following earmarks from ALI 200597:

- 108 - \$3,500,000 in each fiscal year for the Ohio Alliance of
109 Boys and Girl Clubs;
- 110 - \$750,000 in FY 2024 for the J. Harrington & Marie E.
111 Glidden Foundation and the reappropriation of the unused
112 balance of the set aside at the end of FY 2024 for the
113 same purpose in FY 2025;

- 114 - \$598,000 in each fiscal year for instruction for high
115 school students in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the
116 use of an automated external defibrillator;
- 117 - \$225,000 in each fiscal year for the Stark Education
118 Partnership;
- 119 - \$100,000 in each fiscal year for the Ohio Valley Youth
120 Network to support its Sycamore Youth Center Education
121 Enrichment and Life Skills After Schools Program;
- 122 - \$100,000 in each fiscal year for the Girl Scouts of North
123 East Ohio to support the Community Connection Team
124 Building Program.

125 Earmarks \$1,800,000 in each fiscal year from ALI 200597 for
126 six United Way partner agencies to serve vulnerable residents,
127 families, and households in the counties within their
